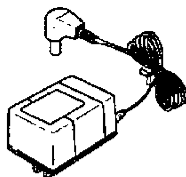

Unpacking

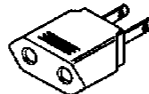

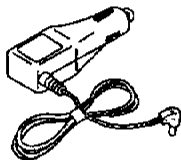

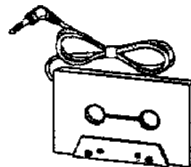

- 1. Three Power Supply System** Dry batteries, car batteries, and household electric power can be used for the power supply. You can listen to music everywhere.
- 2. D.A.S.C. Function** The built-in D.A.S.C. (Digital Anti-Shock Circuit) function uses digital memory to prevent sound skip caused by shaking or shocks.
- 3. Program Playback** Up to 20 tracks can be stored at random for playback in the programmed sequence.
- 4. Versatile Playback Functions** Playback can be enjoyed with repetition of a single track, repetition of all tracks, introduction scanning, etc.

Please read all of the safety and operating instructions before operating this unit. For best results, follow all warnings placed on the unit and adhere to the operating and use instructions. These safety and operating instructions should be retained for future reference.

- 1. Power sources** — The unit should be connected to a power supply only of the type described in the operating instructions or as marked on the appliance.
- 2. Power-cord protection** — Power-supply cords should be routed so that they are not likely to be walked on or pinched by items placed upon or against them, pay particular attention to cords at plugs, convenience receptacles, and the point where they exit from the unit.
- 3. Enclosure removal** — Never remove the enclosure. If the internal parts are touched accidentally, a serious electric shock might occur.
- 4. Drop** — Do not drop the unit or apply strong shock to it. (Damage due to dropping the unit is not covered by the warranty.)
- 5. Ventilation** — Avoid hindering the ventilation of the unit by covering it with a cloth, etc.

Selecting fine audio equipment such as the unit you've just purchased is only the start of your musical enjoyment. Now it's time to consider how you can maximize the fun and excitement your equipment offers. This manufacturer and the Electronic Industries Association's Consumer Electronics Group want you to get the most out of your equipment by playing it at a safe level. One that lets the sound come through loud and clear without annoying blaring or distortion — and, most importantly, without affecting your sensitive hearing.

Sound can be deceiving. Over time your hearing "comfort level" adapts to higher volumes of sound. So what sounds "normal" can actually be loud and harmful to your hearing. Guard against this by setting your equipment at a safe level BEFORE your hearing adapts.

To establish a safe level:

- Start your volume control at a low setting.
- Slowly increase the sound until you can hear it comfortably and clearly, and without distortion.

Once you have established a comfortable sound level:

- Set the dial and leave it there.

Taking a minute to do this now will help to prevent hearing damage or loss in the future. After all, we want you listening for a lifetime.

We Want You Listening For A Lifetime

Used wisely, your new sound equipment will provide a lifetime of fun and enjoyment. Since hearing damage from loud noise is often undetectable until it is too late, this manufacturer and the Electronic Industries Association's Consumer Electronics Group recommend you avoid prolonged exposure to excessive noise. This list of sound levels is included for your protection.

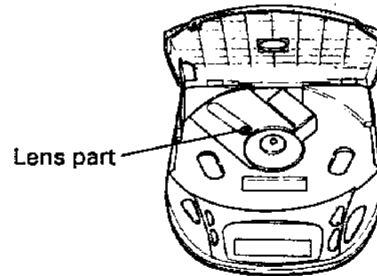

Before operation

■ Simple maintenance

Lens maintenance

Stain on the laser pickup lens may cause sound skip or other troubles making CD playback impossible. Clean the lens using a commercially-available camera blower, etc. Do not use commercially-available lens cleaner or disc cleaner.

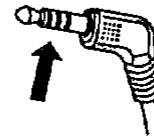


Cabinet maintenance

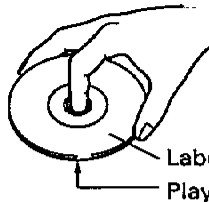
If the cabinet becomes dirty, wipe with a soft, dry cloth. Serious stain or dirt can be wiped with a wet cloth. Do not use benzine or thinner for these may damage the unit.

Taking care of the plug

Wipe the plug with a dry, soft cloth and always keep it clean. A dirty plug can cause noise or erroneous operation.



Disc handling precautions



Handling

Hold compact discs so that you do not touch the playing surface.

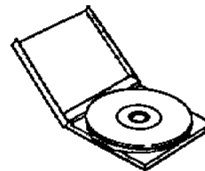


Cleaning

If fingerprints or foreign matter become attached to the disc, lightly wipe the disc with a soft cotton cloth (or similar) from the center of the disc outwards in a radial manner.



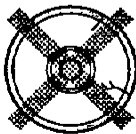
Do not attach paper or tape to either the playing side or the label side of compact discs.



Storage

When a disc is not to be played for a long period of time, remove it from the CD player and store it in its case.

Caution on disc used



Never play a cracked or warped disc.

During playback, the disc rotates at high speed in the player. Therefore, to avoid danger, never use a cracked or deformed disc or a disc repaired with tape or adhesive agent.

Condensation

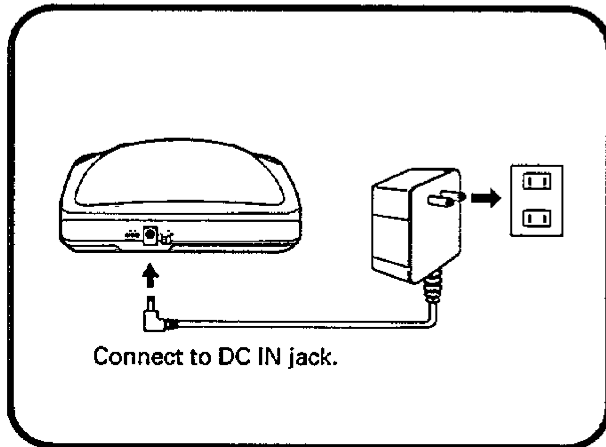
- When the unit is used immediately after a heater has been turned on, or if it is used in a damp or humid room, condensation may be formed on the lens inside the unit, resulting in malfunction. In such a case, leave the unit OFF for about an hour before inserting a disc and starting playback.

Power supplies

This unit can be powered with batteries, a household power supply, a car battery, and other power sources. For battery operation, use commercially-available alkaline batteries or rechargeable batteries (NB-77/NB-88).

When the unit is not used for a long time (a week or more), remove the batteries from the unit.

■ Operation on household power supply

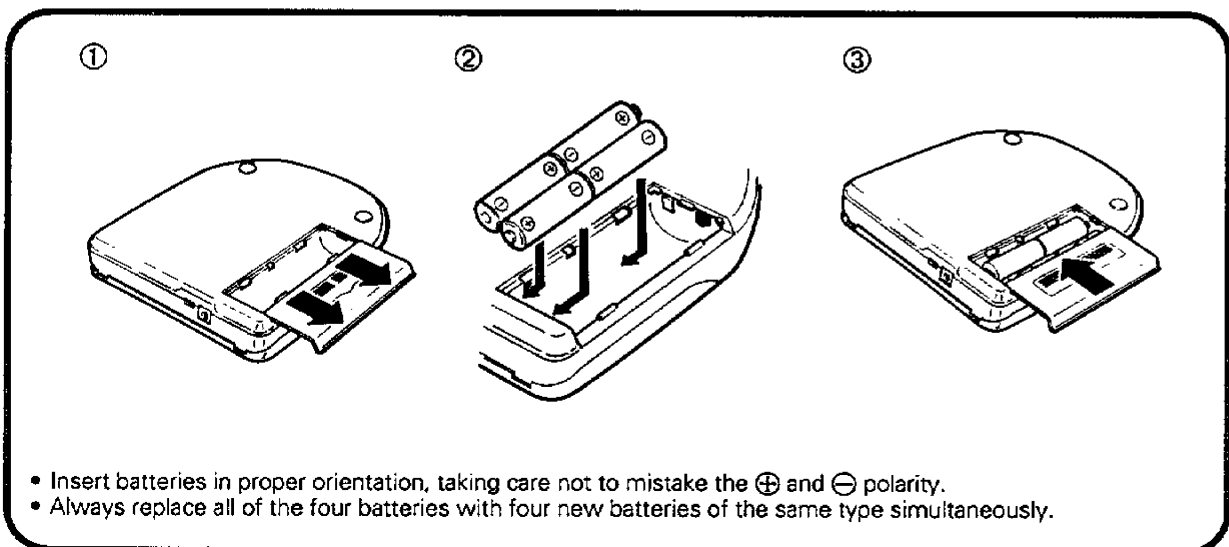


Caution in use of AC adaptor:


1. Never use other AC adaptor than that supplied with this unit.
2. When the unit is not to be used, unplug the AC adaptor from the power outlet.

■ Operation on alkaline batteries

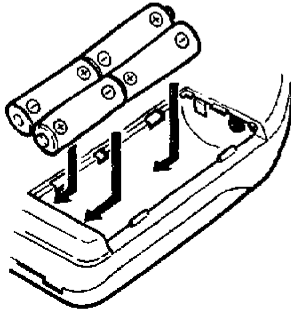
When the unit is to be powered from batteries, use commercially sold "LR6" alkaline batteries. They make about 5 hours of playback possible under normal temperatures.



■ Operation on rechargeable batteries (OPTIONAL)

Be sure to recharge the batteries when they are used for the first time, when they have not been used for a long period or when the low voltage warning indicator () is blinking. When the batteries have been fully charged for about 8 hours, about 2 hours of playback can be obtained at normal temperatures. Use only NB-77/NB-88 rechargeable batteries, which are sold separately. Do not use batteries other than the specially designated rechargeable batteries.

1 Insert rechargeable batteries.



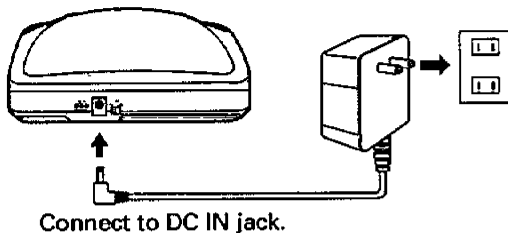
Blinks.



- Insert them taking care not to mistake the orientations of the \oplus and \ominus poles.
- Batteries cannot be recharged during playback.
- A rechargeable battery can be recharged about 500 times. When the operable period shortens, please purchase new optional rechargeable batteries (NB-77/NB-88).

2 Start recharging.

- ① Confirm that all indicator lights are OFF.
- ② Connect the AC adaptor.



Connect to DC IN jack.

- Recharging completes in about 8 hours.

- ③ After charging, disconnect the AC adaptor from the wall outlet and the unit.

- Be sure to shut the cover of the unit during recharging.
- Avoid recharging the battery for more than 8 hours.

ATTENTION

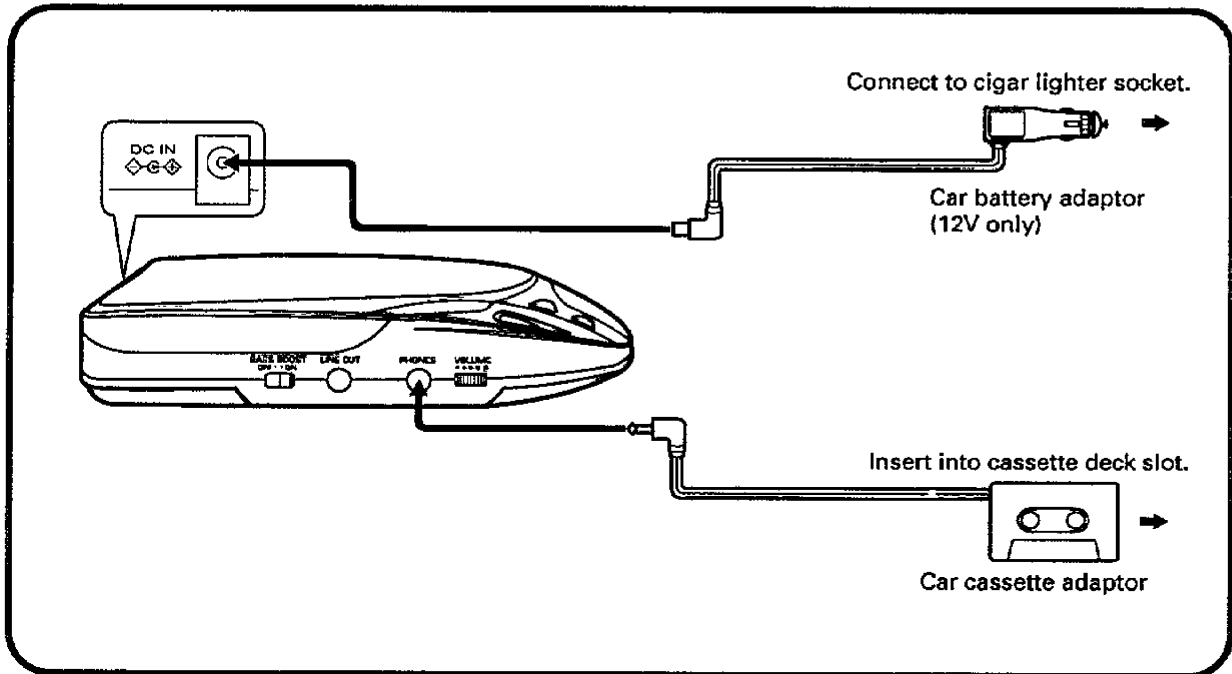
Nickel-Cadmium battery must be recycled or disposed of properly. State laws may vary regarding the handling and disposal of Nickel-Cadmium batteries.

Note:

As an inherent characteristic of rechargeable batteries, the charging capacity drops if a battery is recharged several times while the charge remaining in it is large. In such a case, the original charging capacity can be recovered gradually by recharging it only after the charge has been exhausted completely several times.

■ When a car battery is used



- Place the unit in a stable position not subject to the vibrations of the car.
- The plug may not match the cigar lighter socket of some car models.
- If sound is not produced, change the tape playing direction of the car stereo.
(Sound is not produced if the car stereo is set to play tape side B.)
- The sound reproduction may not be possible with some car stereo models.

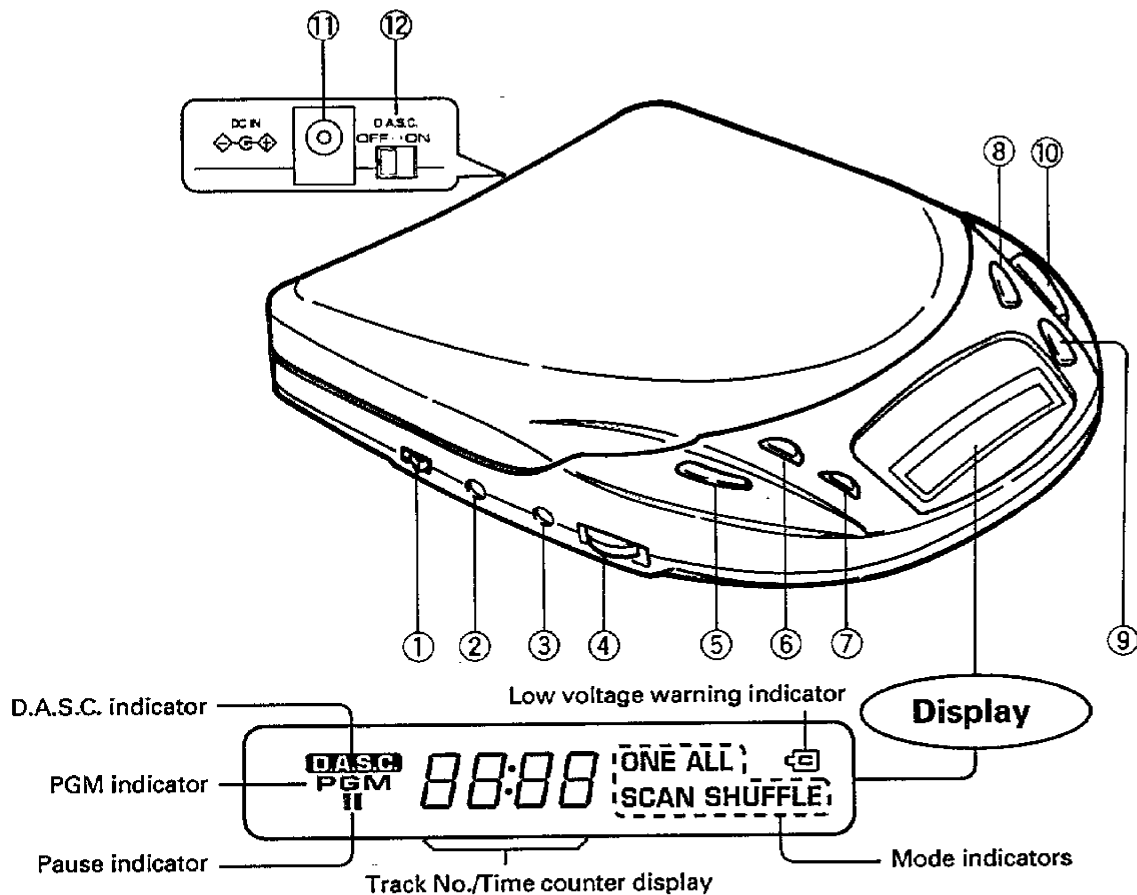
Notes:

1. If the unit cannot be operated with the car battery adaptor connected, suspect the possibility of a blown fuse. The fuse can be replaced by turning the electrode on the tip of the adaptor plug. When replacing the fuse, be sure to use a fuse with a rating of 1 A.
2. Do not leave the products or batteries in the car, particularly above the dashboard, for this may lead to malfunction or damage due to solar heat.
3. When the unit is not used, unplug the car battery adaptor. (Otherwise, the car battery may run out, with some car models.)
4. If the unit is connected to a car stereo using an audio cord, noise may sometimes interfere.

In case of abnormality such as smoke production, immediately unplug the car battery adaptor from the cigar lighter socket.

Controls and indicators

■ Main unit



① BASS BOOST switch

Changes the sound quality.

② LINE OUT jack

This is used for connection of other equipment.

③ PHONES jack (Headphones)

Insert a car cassette adaptor or a headphone mini-plug.

④ VOLUME knob

Adjusts volume.

⑤ OPEN key

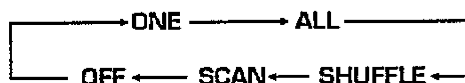
Press to open the top cover.

⑥ MEMORY key

Used to program track sequence.

⑦ MODE key

Enables various playback operations.



⑧ PLAY/PAUSE key

When pressed, power is automatically turned ON and playback starts. When pressed during playback, playback is paused; when pressed again, playback is resumed.

⑨ STOP key

Stops playback. Power is automatically turned OFF when playback is stopped.

⑩ SKIP/SEARCH keys

Used to skip a track or for fast forward/rewind operation.

⑪ DC IN jack (External DC power input)

For use with an external power supply.

⑫ D.A.S.C. switch

Guard against sound skip operates when the switch is set to ON.

Guard against sound skip

The D.A.S.C. stores digital data corresponding to about 1 second of CD playback in memory and reads this data as it plays music. This guards the listener from being troubled by sound skip even in case signal reading error occurs.

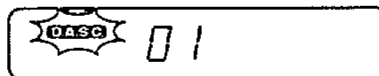

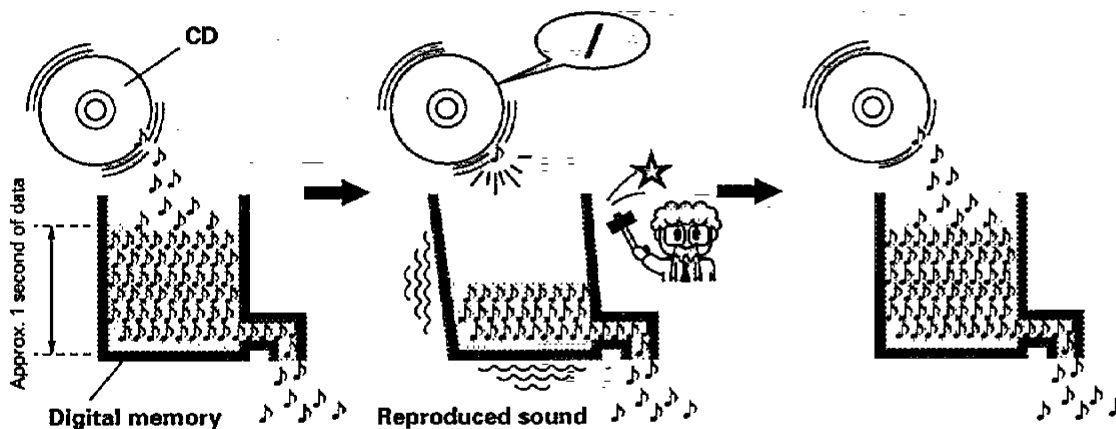
- Playback sound is interrupted when the switch position is changed.

Lights.



- In case of vibration above a certain degree, the memory data may be exhausted and the guard from sound skip may become temporarily ineffective.
- The use of the D.A.S.C. consumes the battery power quickly. When playing the unit in a place not subject to vibration, be sure to set the switch to the OFF position.

Mechanism of D.A.S.C.

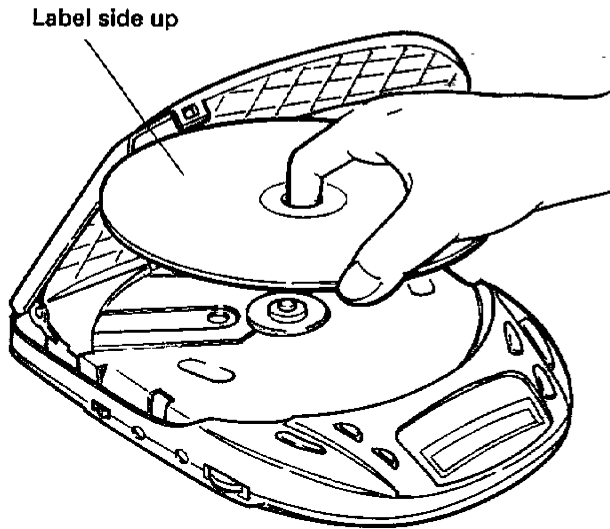


During playback, the CD is rotated at double the normal speed and the sound data of approx. 1 second beyond the present playback position is stored in memory.

When the readout from the CD is interrupted due to a vibration or shock, the sound data read from the memory is not interrupted.

The amount of stored data recovers so that the circuit can deal with the next possible shock.

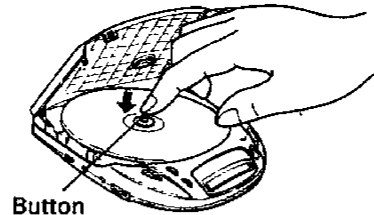


■ To insert a disc

1 Open the cover.

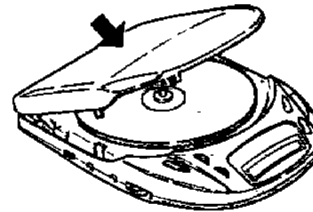

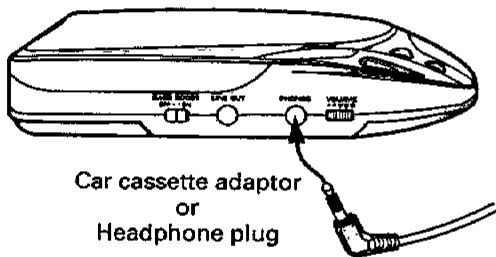
- Fit the center pivot into the disc hole and press the button.

■ Connecting to PHONES jack

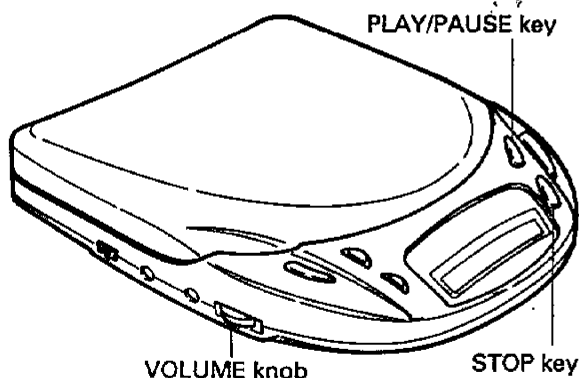


- Use headphones equipped with a stereo mini-plug.

8 cm single CD

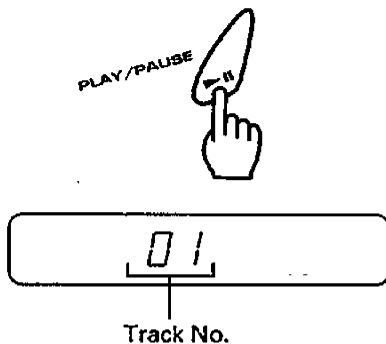
- This unit can play 8 cm single CD directly, without the help of an adaptor. (Do not use single CD adaptor sold in audio or record stores, for this may lead to malfunction.)

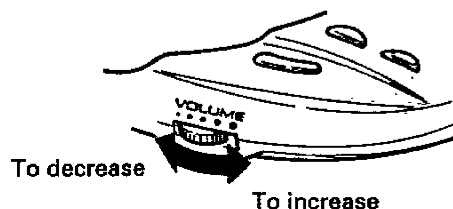
■ Normal playback

1 Start playback.

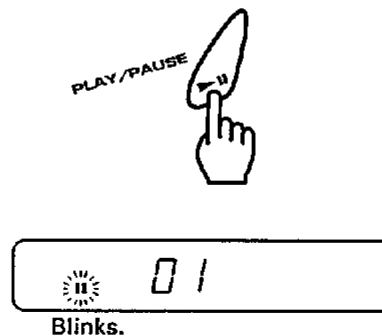


- When the key is pressed, the power comes ON and playback starts.

2 Adjust the volume.

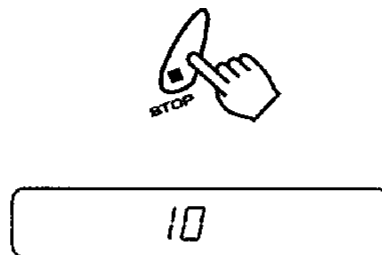


Pausing playback

To stop playback

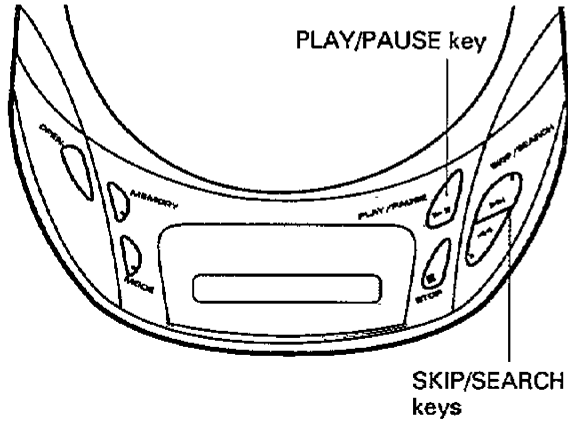


- Total track No. and total playing time are displayed alternately.

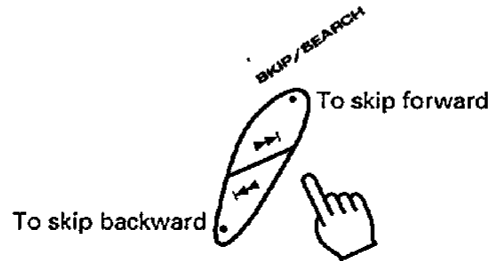







■ Track search

Specifying the skip destination track

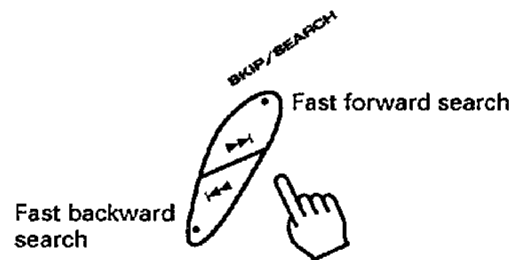
Tap lightly the SKIP/SEARCH keys corresponding to the direction you want to skip during playback.



- The same number of tracks as the number of times the key is tapped are skipped.
- When the  key is tapped once during playback, the track being played will be replayed from the beginning.
- To skip the track in the stop mode, press the ,  key, then press the  key.

Fast forward or fast backward search

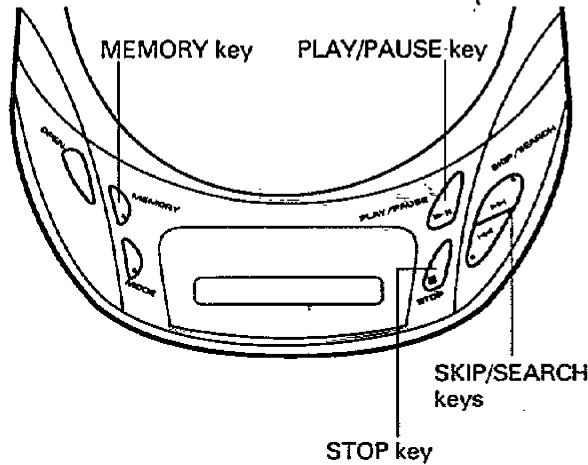
Press and hold the SKIP/SEARCH keys corresponding to the direction you want to search during playback.



- Normal playback resumes from the position you release the key.

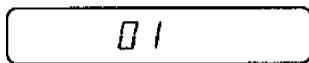
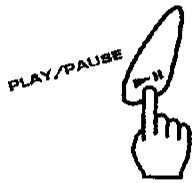
Programmed playback

20 tracks can be programmed into the memory in any order. Once 20 tracks have been programmed into the memory, **FULL** is displayed, indicating that no more tracks can be programmed.



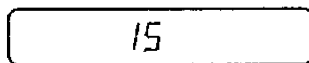

Varying the tone

This unit has the Bass Boost function which allows to enjoy more powerful sound by enhancing the low frequencies. Switch this function ON or OFF to select the tone you like.

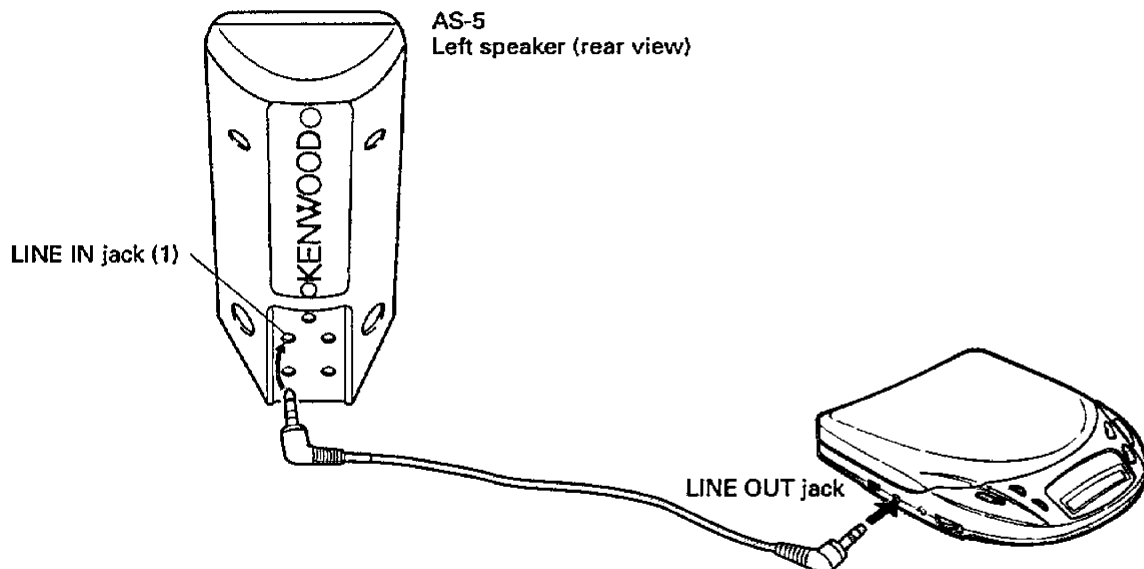

Listening through speaker system (option)

This unit can be connected to the KENWOOD's Active Speaker (AS-5, AS-7 etc.).



Notes:

1. Be sure to turn the power of the speakers OFF before connecting them to this unit.
2. The playback volume should be adjusted on the speakers.
3. The Bass Boost function of this unit is defeated while the speaker system is connected.

In case of difficulty

What seems to be a serious trouble is often due to simple mistake. In case of trouble, check it again by referring to the table below.

Note that servicing may be charged if it is requested based on the following symptoms.

Notes:
