Install the SIM card and battery

1. Remove the battery cover and insert the SIM card.



2. Insert the battery and replace the battery cover.



Charge the battery

1. Plug the supplied travel adapter.



2. When charging is finished, unplug the travel adapter.



Do not remove the battery from the phone before unplugging the travel adapter first. Otherwise, the phone may be damaged.

Turn your phone on or off

- To turn your phone on,
- 1. Open the phone.
- 2. Press and hold [].
- 3. Enter your PIN and press < OK > (if necessary). To turn your phone off, repeat steps 1 and 2 above.

Access menus

To access your phone's menus.

1. In Idle mode, press < Menu> to access Menu mode.



You may need to press [OK] to access Menu mode

2. Use the navigation key to scroll to a menu or option.

- 3. Press <Select>, <Save>, or [OK] to confirm the highlighted option.
- 4. Press <Back> to move up one level; Press [ক] to return to Idle mode.

Make a call

- 1. In Idle mode, enter an area code and a phone
- 2. Press [-] to dial the number.
- 3. To end the call, press [].



The volume through mono headsets is very low or virtually inaudiable. Use stereo headsets only.

Answer a call

- 1. When a call comes in, press [-].
- 2. To end the call, press [].

Adjust the volume

To adjust the volume of the ringtone

- 1. In Menu mode, select **Settings** → **Profiles**.
- 2. Scroll to the phone profile you are using.
- 3. Press **Options** \rightarrow **Edit**.
- 4. Select Volume → Call alert.
- 5. Scroll left or right to adjust the volume level.
- 6. Press <Save>.

To adjust the volume of voice during a call

While a call is in progress, press the up or down navigation key to adjust the earpiece volume.

Change your ringtone

- 1. In Menu mode, select **Settings** \rightarrow **Profiles**.
- 2. Scroll to the phone profile you are using.
- 3. Press **Options** \rightarrow **Edit**.
- 4. Select Call ringtone.
- Select a ringtone category → a ringtone.

Call a recently dialled number

- 1. In Idle mode, press [-].
- 2. Scroll left or right to select a call type.
- 3. Scroll up or down to select a number or name.
- 4. Press [OK] to view details of the call or [-] to dial

Enter text

To change the text input mode

- Press and hold [*] to switch to an input mode. Depending on your region, you may be able to access an input mode for your specific language.
- Press [*] to change case or switch to Number mode.
- · Press and hold [#] to switch to Symbol mode.

T9 mode

- 1. Press the appropriate alphanumeric keys to enter an entire word.
- 2. When the word displays correctly, press [#] to insert a space. If the correct word does not display, press [0] to select an alternate word.

ABC mode

Press the appropriate alphanumeric key until the character you want appears on the display.

Number mode

Press the appropriate alphanumeric key to enter a

Symbol mode

Press the appropriate alphanumeric key to select a symbol.



- To move the cursor, press the navigation key.
- To delete characters one by one, press < Clear >. To delete all of the characters, press and hold <Clear>.
- To insert a space between characters, press [#].
- · To enter punctuation marks, press [1].

Add a new contact

- 1. In Idle mode, enter a phone number and press <Options> → Create contact.
- 2. Select a number type.
- 3. Enter contact information.
- 4. Press < Options > → Save to add the contact to memory.

Send and view messages

To send a text message

- 1. In Menu mode, select Messages -Create new message.
- 2. Enter a destination number and scroll down.
- 3. Enter your message text and press < Options > \rightarrow Send to send the message.

To view text messages

- 1. In Menu mode, select **Messages** → **Inbox**.
- 2. Select a text message.

Activate the mobile tracker

This feature helps track your phone when it is stolen or when someone tries to use your phone using other SIM card, the phone will automatically send the preset tracking message to family or friends. This feature may be unavailable due to certain features supported by your service provider.

- 1. In Menu mode, select **Settings** \rightarrow **Security** \rightarrow Mobile tracker.
- 2. Enter a new 4- to 8-digit password and press <OK>.
- 3. Enter the new password again and press < OK >.
- 4. Scroll left or right to On.
- 5. Scroll down and press [OK] to open the recipient list.
- 6. Press <Options $> \rightarrow$ Phonebook to open your contact list.

- 9. Press <**Options** $> \rightarrow$ **Save** to save the recipients. 10. Scroll down and enter the sender's name.

11. Press <Options> → Save → <Accept>.

- 7. Scroll to a contact and press [OK].
- 8. Select a number (if necessary).

Set and use alarms

- To set a new alarm
- 1. In Menu mode, select Alarms. 2. Scroll to an empty alarm location and press [OK].
- 3. Set alarm details. 4. Press <Save>.

To stop an alarm

When the alarm sounds,

- · Press any key to stop an alarm without snooze.
- Press <OK> or [OK] to stop an alarm with snooze, or press <Snooze> or any key to silence the alarm for the snooze period.

To deactivate an alarm

- 1. In Menu mode, select Alarms.
- 2. Scroll to the alarm you want to deactivate and press [OK].
- 3. Scroll left or right to Off. 4. Press <Save

If the battery has been removed, the scheduled alarm

Make fake calls You can simulate fake incoming calls when you want to

get out of meetings or unwanted conversations.

To make a fake call Press and hold the navigation key down in Idle mode.

To change the time delay before fake calls

In Menu mode, select **Settings** → **Application** → Fake call → Fake call timer → an option.
