

When not used for extended periods of time, set your computer to DPMS. If using a screen saver, set it to the active screen mode.

 If the size of your monitor is small, or if the same image is present for long periods of time, you may see afterimages due to damage to the fluorescent substance on the inside of the CDT.



Do not use a damaged or loose plug.

• This may cause an electric shock or fire.



Do not pull the plug out by the wire nor touch the plug with wet hands.

• This may cause an electric shock or fire.



Use only a properly grounded plug and receptacle.

 An improper ground may cause electric shock or equipment damage.



- Do not excessively bend the plug and wire nor place heavy objects upon them, which could cause damage.

When cleaning the monitor case or the surface of the CDT, wipe with a slightly moistened, soft fabric.

Do not clean Flat monitor with water. Use a water-diluted mild detergent.

(Some detergents contain significant amounts of alcohol-based solvents, which can damage (color change) or crack the monitor case. The antiglare/anti-static surface coating on the CDT may also be affected.)

Dilute the detergent (1:10 ratio) with water before using.



Do not spray detergent directly on the monitor.



Use the recommended detergent with a smooth cloth.

- You can prevent the coated CDT from being damaged or the monitor cabinet from being dissolved, cracked or discolored.
- You can buy a recommended detergent at any Samsung Service Center.



Caution: Use a recommended detergent only, as other surfactants containing large amounts of alcohol, solvent or other strong substances, can discolor or crack the monitor or damage the coated CDT.



- If the connector between the plug and the pin is dusty or dirty, clean it properly with a dry cloth.
  - A dirty connector can cause an electric shock or fire.



- Do not set a glass of water, chemicals or any small metal objects on the monitor.
  - This may cause damage, electric shock or a fire.
  - If a foreign substance gets into the monitor, disconnect the plug and then contact a service center.

- Do not remove cover(or back). No user serviceable parts inside.







- **1. Signal Cable** Connect the signal cable to the video port on your computer, video board, video card, or graphics card.

To execute X-Window, you need to make the X86Config file, which is a type of system setting file.

- 1. Press Enter at the first and the second screen after executing the X86Config file.
- 2. The third screen is for **setting your mouse**.
- 3. Set a mouse for your computer.
- 4. The next screen is for selecting a keyboard.
- 5. Set a Keyboard for your computer.
- 6. The next screen is for **setting your monitor**.
- 7. First of all, set a **horizontal frequency** for your monitor. (You can enter the frequency directly.)
- 8. Set a **vertical frequency** for your monitor. (You can enter the frequency directly.)
- 9. Enter the **model name of your monitor**. This information will not affect the actual execution of X-Window.
- 10. You have **finished** setting up your monitor.

**Execute** X-Window after setting other requested hardware.

With the built-in pedestal, you can tilt and/or swivel the monitor for the most comfortable viewing angle.



Note: The base is detachable.





#### **Attaching the Base**

- 1. Place the monitor upside-down on a flat work surface.
- 2. Align the tabs on the base with the corresponding slots on the bottom of the monitor.
- 3. Press the base onto the monitor until the tabs are fully engaged in the slots.
- 4. Push the base toward the front of the monitor until the release latch clicks into the locked position.
  - \* Do not bend the snap.

### Removing the Base

- 5. Squeeze and pull up on the release latch on the base.
- 6. Push the base toward the back of the monitor and lift up to remove the base.

Note: The base will align with the monitor slots in only one position.





### Color1

Color temperature is a measure of the 'warmth' of the image colors. The available range is between 5000 to 9300K. Follow these steps to change the color temperature and adjust individual R,G,B color control. Note: Recall does not reset the color settings.

- Push the Menu( 📦 ) button.
- 2 Push the button or button until the Color screen is displayed. Use the button or button to select Color1.
- Push the Menu( 📦 ) button to open the Color1 adjustment screen.
- Adjust the color temperature as close to the desired temperature as possible using only the and buttons. To fine tune the color hue, use the or button to select R(ed), G(reen) or B(lue), then use the and buttons until you reach the desired color.



### Color2

Color temperature is a measure of the 'warmth' of the image colors. The available range is between 5000 to 9300K. Follow these steps to change the color temperature and adjust individual R,G,B color control.

Note: Recall does not reset the color settings.

- 1 Push the Menu( 🗐 ) button.





## sRGB

When you adjust the Brightness and Contrast after sRGB mode is selected, sRGB mode exits.

sRGB mode works in Digital input.

- 1. Push the Menu ( 📦 ) button.

- 3. Push the ▲ and ▼-button to select Color1, Color2 or sRGB





# Purity


Adjust the color purity of the picture.

- 1 Push the Menu( 📦 ) button.

- 3 Push the Menu( 📦 ) button to open the Purity adjustment screen.





## Clear Moire

A 'moire' pattern can appear on your screen, looking like a series of concentric circles or arcs.

To eliminate this pattern, use the clear moire adjustments.

- Push the Menu( 🗐 ) button.
- 2 Push the button or button until the Screen OSD is displayed.
  Push the button or button to select Clear Moire.
- 3 Push the Menu( 📦 ) button to open the Clear Moire adjustment screen.
  - Use the button or button to adjust horizontal moire; use the button or button to adjust vertical moire.





## Linearity


Adjust the linearity setting when the display image is compressed at the left, right or top, bottom.




### Focus

Use the focus control when the image displayed on the screen is not sharp in all areas.

- Push the Menu ( 😛 ) button.
- Push the button or button until the Screen OSD is displayed. Push the button or button to select Focus.

- 4 Use the button or button to adjust the focus along the left and right areas of the screen.

Use the button or button to adjust the center area of the screen.





## Convergence

Convergence affects picture clarity. Adjust the horizontal or vertical convergence to properly align the color dots that make up the image.



- Push the button or button until the Screen OSD is displayed. Push the button or button to select Convergence.
- Push the Menu ( ) button to open the Convergence adjustment screen.
- Use the button or button to adjust the horizontal convergence.


The Degauss feature will remove color impurities caused by magnetic fields. Do not use the Degauss feature more than once within a 30-minute period.

Note: The monitor may buzz momentarily, the image colors may change and the image will jiggle for a few seconds. These effects are normal.



- Push the Menu( 😛 ) button.
- 2 Push the button or button until the Advanced screen is displayed.
- Push the Menu( ) button to execute the degauss function.

  The degaussing screen will appear. After a few seconds, the degauss main menu will return.



## Recall

Use the recall feature to reset these monitor settings to their original levels: Position, Size, Pincushion, Trapezoid, Parallelogram, Pinbalance, Rotation, Clear Moire.

Note: If you have selected "Yes", all settings listed above will be reset. All other settings will remain the same.

- Push the Menu( 🗐 ) button.
- 2 Push the button or button until the Advanced screen is displayed.


  Push the button or button to select Recall.
- 3 Push the Menu( 📦 ) button to open the recall selection screen.
  - Push the button to select YES.

    If you don't want to reset the monitor, use the button to select NO.

## Video Input Level

Some video cards use video signals higher than 1.0V which causes the display to be very bright.

For those video cards, use this feature to select the 1.0 V Level.

- Push the Menu ( 😛 ) button.
- 2 Push the button or button until the Advanced screen is displayed. Push the button or button to select Video Input Level.
- 3 Push the Menu ( ) button to open the Video Input Level selection screen.
  - Use the or buttons to select 0.7 V or 1.0 V.

# Sync. Input Type

Use this menu to set your monitor to the correct type of synchronization. Select 'Separate' if the computer is sending a separate synchronization signal. Select 'Sync. on Green' if the computer expects the monitor to synchronize with the green signal it sends. Refer to your computer or video card user's manual to determine the correct setting.

- Push the Menu ( 🛺 ) button.
- 2 Push the button or button until the Advanced screen is displayed.
  Push the button or button to select Sync. Input Type.
- 3 Push the Menu ( ) button to open the Sync. Input Type selection screen.
  - Use the button or button to select Separate or Sync. on Green.



## D-SUB/BNC

Use this menu to choose between the signal source connected to the BNC connector input and the signal source connected to the D-SUB connector input. Note: When you are finished, wait for a few seconds and the screen will blank then display the image from the new signal source(other computer). A cable must be connected to both inputs to use this function.

- 1 Push the Menu ( 🕡 ) button.
- 2 Push the button or button until the Advanced screen is displayed. Push the button or button to select D-SUB/BNC.
- 3 Push the Menu ( 📦 ) button to open the D-SUB/BNC selection screen.
  - Use the button or button to select D-SUB or BNC.




## Display timing

You can see the frequency (user control mode) used by the user, the polarity of the operational signals, the default frequency (default mode) set when you buy the monitor and the resolution level.

Note: These screens do not allow any changes to the settings, they are for information only.

- 2 Push the button or button until the Menu screen is displayed.


## **Position**

This setting adjusts the vertical or horizontal position of the image area on the screen.

- **1. Selection and Adjustment**: Place and click your mouse pointer on the Position icon and then drag it as desired. The entire image area of the screen will move freely in any direction, according to the mouse cursor movement.
- **2. Fine Tuning :** When the mouse pointer is correctly placed over the Position icon, the icon color will change. Then, click the left mouse button. The fine tuning sub-menu appears in the bottom left corner of the screen. When the mouse cursor is correctly placed over any of the fine tuning arrows, the arrow color changes, as it does when an icon is selected. Click the left mouse button to achieve the desired Position fine tuning.
- 3. Holding the mouse button down will cause the value to change rapidly.








## **Size**

This setting adjusts the image area height and width on the screen.

To increase the Width, drag outward on the grid where the icons are located. To decrease the Width, drag inward. To increase the Height, drag upward on the grid where the icons are located. To decrease the Height, drag downward.
- **2. Fine Tuning :** When the mouse pointer is correctly placed over the Size icon, the icon color changes. Then, click the left mouse button. The fine tuning sub-menu appears in the bottom left corner of the screen. When the mouse cursor is correctly placed over any of the Size fine tuning arrows, the arrow color changes, as it does when an icon is selected. Then, click the left mouse button to achieve the desired Size fine tuning.
- **3**. Holding the mouse button down will cause the value to change rapidly.













- **2. Fine Tuning :** When the mouse pointer is correctly placed over the Pin Balance icon, the icon color changes. Then, click the left mouse button and the Pin Balance fine tuning sub-menu appears in the left bottom corner of the screen. When the mouse cursor is correctly placed over either of the left or right arrows, the arrow color changes, as it does when an icon is selected. Then, click the left mouse button to achieve the desired Pin Balance fine tuning.
- 3. Holding the mouse button down will cause the value to change rapidly.








## **Trapezoid**

This adjusts the horizontal width of the image area on the screen.

- **1. Selection and Adjustment**: Place and click the mouse pointer on the Trapezoid icon and then drag it as desired. The Trapezoid icon is located on the top and bottom sides. If the mouse is dragged to the left, the upper image area narrows and the bottom part widens. If the mouse is dragged to the right, the upper image area widens and the bottom part narrows.
- **2. Fine Tuning :** When the mouse pointer is correctly placed over the Trapezoid icon, the icon color changes. Then, click the left mouse button and the Trapezoid fine tuning sub-menu appears in the left bottom corner of the screen. When the mouse cursor is correctly placed over either of the left or right arrows, the arrow color changes, as it does when an icon is selected. Then, click the left mouse button to achieve the desired Trapezoid fine tuning.
- **3**. Holding the mouse button down will cause the value to change rapidly.








## **Parallel**

This adjusts the parallelogram level of the screen.

- **1. Selection and Adjustment**: Place and click the mouse pointer on the Parallelogram icon and then drag as desired. The Parallelogram icon is located in the screen corners. If the mouse is dragged to the left, the image area tilts to the right. If the mouse is dragged to the right, the image area tilts to the left.
- **2. Fine Tuning :** When the mouse pointer is correctly placed over the Parallelogram icon, the icon color changes. Then, click the left mouse button to pop up the Parallelogram fine tuning sub-menu in the left bottom corner of the screen. When the mouse cursor is correctly placed over either of the left or right arrows, the arrow color changes, as it does when the icon is selected. Then, click the left mouse button to achieve the desired Parallelogram fine tuning.
- **3**. Holding the mouse button down will cause the value to change rapidly.







## **Moire**

This setting removes wavy concentric circles or arc patterns.

- **1. Selection and Adjustment**: Place and click your mouse pointer on the Moire icon and then drag it as desired. The icon is located in the left and right corners of the screen. The value decreases when the arrow is dragged to the left, and increases when the arrow is dragged to the right.
- **2. Fine Tuning**: When the mouse pointer is correctly placed over the Moire icon, the icon color changes. Then, click the left mouse button and its fine tuning sub-menu appears in the bottom left corner of the screen. When the mouse cursor is correctly placed over either of the left or right arrows, the arrow color changes, as it does when an icon is selected. Then, click your left mouse button to achieve the desired Moire fine tuning.
- 3. Holding the mouse button down will cause the value to change rapidly.







## Sidepin Corner

This setting fine tunes the side pins of the screen corners in their opposite directions.

- **1. Selection and Adjustment**: Place and click the mouse pointer on the Corner Side Pin icon and then drag it as desired. The icons are divided into Top and Bottom Corner Side Pin icons and are located in the upper and lower parts, respectively. The upper icon is for the Top Corner Side pin adjustment while the lower icon is for the Bottom Corner Side Pin adjustment. If the mouse is dragged to the left, for both the icons, the corner side pins shrink inward. If the mouse is dragged to the right, they expand outward.
- **2. Fine Tuning :** When the mouse pointer is correctly placed over the Corner Side Pin icon, the icon color changes. Then, click the left mouse button and the Corner Side Pin fine tuning sub-menu appears in the bottom left corner of the screen. When the mouse cursor is correctly placed over either of the left or right arrows, the arrow color changes, as it does when an icon is selected. Then, click the left mouse button to achieve the desired fine tuning.
- 3. Holding the mouse button down will cause the value to change rapidly.







## **Pinbalance Corner**

This setting fine tunes the side pins of the screen corners, by aligning them in the same direction.

- **1. Selection and Adjustment**: Place and click the mouse pointer on the Corner Pin Balance icon and drag it as desired. The Top Corner Pin Balance adjustment icon is located in the top left and right corners of the screen. The Bottom Corner Pin Balance adjustment icon is located in the bottom left and right corners of the screen. For both icons, if the mouse is dragged to the left, the corner side pins are curved to the left. If the mouse is dragged to the right, they are curved to the right.
- **2. Fine Tuning :** When the mouse pointer is correctly placed over the Corner Pin Balance icon, the icon color changes. Then, click the left mouse button, and its fine tuning sub-menu appears in the bottom left corner of the screen. When the mouse cursor is correctly placed over either of the left or right arrows, the arrow color changes, as it does when an icon is selected. Then, click the left mouse button to achieve the desired fine tuning.
- 3. Holding the mouse button down will cause the value to change rapidly.








## **Degauss**

This setting removes blurs on the screen, caused by interference from magnetic fields.

**1. Selection and Adjustment**: Place and click the mouse pointer on the Degauss icon that is located in the center of the screen. The picture image may become fuzzy for three to five seconds, with the monitor making a ticking sound when the icon is selected. Any fuzzy screen blotches are removed while the magnetic field affecting the screen is degaussed.

## 1. Reset

This setting cancels adjustments made using the current tab. However, please note that a Reset function is not provided for the Highlight Zone tabs because their nature does not require being reset.

### 2. Save

This setting saves all the adjustments made in the current session since the program was started.

## 3. OK

This closes the monitor setting, saves the current adjustments and exits the program.

## 4. Cancel

This returns the monitor settings to their original state before the current adjustments are saved and exits the program.



# On-Screen Display(Highlight Zone II)

## 1. Automatic detect

- 1) When the Highlight program is running, the monitor automatically detects the video-playing portion of your multimedia program and activates the Highlight Zone feature. No selection is necessary.
- Major multimedia programs: Windows Media Player, RealPlayer 8.0, video players on the broadcasters;
  websites, etc.
  - However, Automatic Detect may not work with a DVD player. (In this case, change the setting to Manual Detect mode to create a Highlight Zone.)
- 3) Select Disable Auto Detect from the menu when you wish to deactivate the Automatic Detect feature. Since this disables the Auto Detect capability of the monitor, the monitor does not automatically create a Highlight Zone.
  - (When you first install the program, Automatic Detect is the default.)

## 2. Manual detect

In Manual Detect mode, you can either select a window or use the Drag function to create a Highlight Zone.

#### 1 Selecting a window:

Click the Highlight icon( ) on the Windows taskbar once to activate( ) the cursor. Move the cursor onto the window of your choice and click once to Highlight the window. Drag: Click the Highlight icon( ) on the Windows taskbar once to activate( ) the cursor.

### 2 Drag

Click the Highlight icon(■)on the Windows taskbar once to activate(■)the cursor.


Click and hold the left mouse button, then drag the cursor to create a rectangle that covers the desired area. This rectangle becomes the Highlight Zone.

- Note 1: When the mouse cursor is activated( ) and it is necessary to de-activate it to use it for other tasks, right click your mouse, or put the activated cursor ( ) on the taskbar and click. When de-activated, the icon on the screen changes back to the one shown before activation.
- Note 2 : You can determine whether the Highlight feature is on/off by the appearance of the icon on the taskbar. On( ), Off( )

## 4. Other Features

The Highlight Zone function remembers the variables of the selected areas in Automatic and Manual Detect modes, respectively.

- 1 If the window selected as a Highlight Zone is moved or its size changed, the Highlight Zone changes accordingly.
- 2 If an un-selected window overlaps the window selected as a Highlight Zone, the Highlight Zone of the selected window turns off.
  - However, it does not turn off the Zone completely and only makes the window shift to standby mode while the settings are saved. When the window is re-activated, the Highlight Zone turns on again with the settings unchanged.
- \* When the Highlight Zone is created using the Drag function, the Zone functions independently of the above since it uses a random portion of the screen instead of a particular window.
- Note 1: How to cancel the saved variables of a selected window.
  - When a window selected in Automatic Detect mode is replaced with another window also selected in Automatic Detect mode, only the last selection is saved, and the Highlight Zone function is deactivated for the previous windows.
  - 2) In Manual Detect mode, only the window (or the frame window) created last is saved, and the Highlight Zone function is de-activated for the previous windows.
    - The Highlight Zone is de-selected when the program used to create the selected window is closed. The variables of the Highlight Zone created using the Drag function are not saved.
- Note 2: The changes saved under Picture Setting of the Highlight Zone menu remain effective even after the program is closed using Exit Program.
  - (The next time you start the Highlight Zone program, the settings are shown as previously saved.)

- If you have problems in installing the adapter (video) driver, boot the computer in Safe Mode, remove the Display Adapter at the "Control Panel, System, Device Administrator" and then reboot the computer to reinstall the adapter (video) driver.

### **Tips for Highlight Zone**

- 1. To protect CDT against the screen brightness, the Highlight Zone function persists for three hours and then automatically stops. So please reset it to continue.
- 2. When the Highlight Zone function is operated, the surrounding brightness of screen may become dark.
- 3. Depending on the video card you use, a color saturation phenomenon may occur in the Highlight Zone. In this case, slightly lower the contrast of the Highlight Zone and the color saturation will be reduced.







### Natural Color Software Program



One of the recent problems in using a computer is that the color of the images printed out by a printer or other images scanned by a scanner or a digital camera are not the same as those shown on the monitor.

The Natural Color S/W is the very solution for this problem. It is a color administration system developed by Samsung Electronics in association with Korea Electronics & Telecommunications Research Institute (ETRI). This system is available only for Samsung monitors and makes the color of the images on the monitor the same as the printed or scanned images. For more information, refer to Help (F1) in the software program.

#### How to install the Natural Color software

Insert the CD included with the Samsung monitor into the CD-ROM Drive. Then, the initial screen of the program installation will be executed. Click Natural Color on the initial screen to install the Natural Color software. To install the program manually, insert the CD included with the Samsung monitor into the CD-ROM Drive, click the [Start] button of Windows and then select [Execute].

Enter D:\color\eng\setup.exe and then press the [Enter] key. (If the drive where the CD is inserted is not D:\, enter the applicable drive.)

### How to delete the Natural Color software program

Select [Setting]/[Control Panel] on the [Start] menu and then double-click [Add/Delete a program].

Select Natural Color from the list and then click the [Add/Delete] button.

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MouScreen™ S/W

MouScreen Program requires built-in USB for use with SyncMaster Products. (Note: SyncMaster 1200NF does not support MouScreen.)

MouScreen is a software program that controls your monitor settings using the USB (Universal Serial Bus) interface.

All monitor settings, adjustments and controls can be managed by the use of the mouse alone. You may select menus or sub-functions by simply clicking the left mouse button and then making the adjustment by dragging the selected icons.

#### **Installation Requirements**

As MouScreen uses a USB connection with your host system, MouScreen can be installed only on systems with a Samsung monitor that is equipped with a USB port.

### Before Running MouScreen V2.01

First, check to ensure the USB port of the monitor is connected to your computer by a root or hub USB port.

If not connected properly, the MouScreen program will not run, displaying the following message:



If the above message is displayed, and the monitor is properly connected to the computer, this means that the operating system has not recognized the USB monitor. Disconnect and then reconnect the USB connection, and run the program again.

#### Uninstalling MouScreen V2.01 from Your Computer

To uninstall MouScreen 2.01 from your system, follow either one of these procedures:

Click Start, Programs, MouScreen 2.01, Uninstall MouScreen 2.01 on your Windows' desktop or click Settings, Control Panel, Program Add/Remove and then click Add/Remove after selecting MouScreen 2.01 in the Program list.

#### Matters to note when changing modes

Make sure your MouScreen program is closed before changing the vertical frequency or resolution.

Otherwise, the program may not work properly as data stored in the monitor may be different from those in the program.

If you close and rerun the program, it will work properly because it reads the modified data.

#### **Conflict with OSD**

In principle, the OSD (on-screen display) does not work when this program runs on the system. As the program shares internal data with the OSD, it will not work properly. Close the MouScreen program before running the OSD.
