Health and Safety Information

Always comply with the following precautions and usage tips to avoid dangerous situations and ensure peak performance of your camera:



Warning—situations that could cause injury to yourself or others



Caution — situations that could cause damage to your camera or other equipment



Note - notes, usage tips, or additional information



Do not use your camera near flammable or explosive gases and liquids

Do not use your camera near fuels, combustibles, or flammable chemicals. Do not store or carry flammable liquids, gases, or explosive materials in the same compartment as the camera or its accessories.

Keep your camera away from small children and pets

Keep your camera and all accessories out of the reach of small children and animals. Small parts may cause choking or serious injury if swallowed. Moving parts and accessories may present physical dangers as well.

Prevent damage to subjects' eyesight

Do not use the flash in close proximity (closer than 1 m/3 ft) to people or animals. Using the flash too close to your subject's eyes can cause temporary or permanent damage.

Handle and dispose of batteries and chargers with care

- Use only Samsung-approved batteries and chargers.
 Incompatible batteries and chargers can cause serious injuries or damage to your camera.
- Never dispose of batteries in a fire. Follow all local regulations when disposing of used batteries.

 Never place batteries or cameras on or in heating devices, such as microwave ovens, stoves, or radiators. Batteries may explode when overheated.



Handle and store your camera carefully and sensibly

- Do not allow your camera to get wet—liquids can cause serious damage. Do not handle your camera with wet hands. Water damage to your camera can void your manufacturer's warranty.
- Do not expose the camera to direct sunlight or high temperatures for an extended period of time. Prolonged exposure to sunlight or extreme temperatures can cause permanent damage to your camera's internal components.
- Avoid using or storing your camera in dusty, dirty, humid, or poorly-ventilated areas to prevent damage to moving parts and internal components.
- Remove the batteries from your camera when storing it for an extended period of time. Installed batteries may leak or corrode over time and cause serious damage to your camera.
- Protect your camera from sand and dirt when using it on beaches or in other similar areas.
- Protect your camera and monitor from impact, rough handling, and excessive vibration to avoid serious damage.

 Exercise caution when connecting cables or adapters and installing batteries and memory cards. Forcing the connectors, improperly connecting cables, or improperly installing batteries and memory cards can damage ports, connectors, and accessories. Do not insert foreign objects into any of your camera's compartments, slots, or access points. Damage due to improper use may not be covered by your warranty.

Protect batteries, chargers, and memory cards from damage

- Avoid exposing batteries or memory cards to very cold or very hot temperatures (below 0° C/32° F or above 40° C/104° F).
 Extreme temperatures can reduce the charging capacity of your batteries and can cause memory cards to malfunction.
- Prevent batteries from making contact with metal objects, as this can create a connection between the + and - terminals of your battery and lead to temporary or permanent battery damage.
- Prevent memory cards from making contact with liquids, dirt, or foreign substances. If dirty, wipe the memory card clean with a soft cloth before inserting in your camera.
- Turn off the camera when inserting or removing the memory card.
- Do not bend drop, or subject memory cards to heavy impact or pressure.
- Do not use memory cards that have been formatted by other cameras or by a PC. Reformat the memory card with your camera.
- Never use a damaged charger, battery, or memory card.

Use only Samsung-approved accessories

Using incompatible accessories may damage your camera, cause injury, or void your warranty.

Protect your camera's lens

- Do not expose the lens to direct sunlight, as this may discolor the image sensor or cause it to malfunction.
- Protect your lens from fingerprints and scratches. Clean your lens with a soft, clean, debris-free lens cloth.

Use earphones with caution

- Do not use earphones while driving, cycling, or operating motorized vehicles. Doing so may create a traffic hazard and may be illegal in some areas.
- Use only the minimum volume setting necessary. Listening to earphones at high volume can damage your hearing.



Allow only qualified personnel to service your camera

Do not allow unqualified personnel to service the camera or attempt to service the camera yourself. Any damage that results from unqualified service is not covered by your warranty.

Ensure maximum battery and charger life

- Overcharging batteries may shorten battery life. After charging is finished, disconnect the cable from your camera.
- Over time, unused batteries will discharge and must be recharged before use.
- Disconnect chargers from power sources when not in use.
- Use batteries only for their intended purpose.

Exercise caution when using the camera in humid environments

When transferring the camera from a cold environment to a warm and humid one, condensation can form on the delicate electronic circuitry and memory card. In this situation, wait for at least 1 hour until all moisture has evaporated before using the camera.




Pressing the shutter

- Half-press [Shutter]: press and hold the shutter half way down
- Press [Shutter]: press the shutter all the way down



Subject, background, and composition

- Subject: the main object of a scene, such as a person, animal, or still life
- Background: the objects around the subject
- Composition: the combination of a subject and background



Exposure (Brightness)

The amount of light that enters your camera is called exposure. By altering the exposure, your photos will be darker or lighter.







Turning your camera on or off

Press [POWER] to turn your camera on or off.



In Playback mode

Press [] to view stored files.





Mini dashboard

While the camera is turned on, Mini dashboard shows you the remaining capacity of the battery and memory card.





- When exposing the camera to a hot and humid environment, condensation can form on the gauges.
- If the hand of a gauge keeps spinning around, contact a service center.
- The gauge and the battery and memory card icon on the display may show different capacities.

Setting options

You can set options by pressing [E], [MENU/OK], or [Fn] and using the navigation buttons ([4], [3], [1], [4]).

- 1 Press [E], [MENU/OK], or [Fn].
- 2 Use the navigation buttons to scroll to an option or menu.
 - To move left or right, press [4] or [3].
 - To move up or down, press [I□I] or [♣].



3 Press [MENU/OK] to confirm the highlighted option or menu.

Going back to the previous menu

Press [E], [Fn], or [MENU/OK] again to go back to the previous menu.




E.g. Select a white balance option in the P mode

1 Rotate the mode dial to P.



- 2 Press [Fn].
- 3 Press [□□] or [♣] and then [♣] or [♦] to set the white balance.



4 Press [MENU/OK].


1 Rotate the mode dial to AUTO.



2 Align your subject in the frame.



3 Half-press [Shutter] to focus.



4 Press [Shutter] to take a photo.

Zooming

You can shoot close-up photos by adjusting the zoom. Your camera has a 5X optical zoom and 5X digital zoom. By using both, you can zoom in up to 25 times.

Push or push and hold [**Zoom**] up to zoom in on your subject. Push or push and hold [**Zoom**] down to zoom out.








Digital zoom

If the zoom indicator is in the digital range, your camera is using the digital zoom. The picture quality may deteriorate when you use the digital zoom.





- The digital zoom is not available when using ு₀, എ, എ, ∩,
 SCENE (in some scenes), and modes and when used with
 Face detection.
- It may take longer to save a photo when using the digital zoom.
- The focus area will be set to Center AF when using the digital zoom.

Reducing camera shake

Reduce camera shake optically by pressing [OIS] in Shooting mode. When you use the OIS function, the OIS icon is displayed.





- . OIS may not function properly when:
 - you move your camera to follow a moving subject
 - you use digital zoom
 - there is too much camera shake
 - the shutter speed is slow
 - (e.g., when you select Nightscene in the SCENE mode)
 - the battery is low
 - you take a close-up shot
- If you use the OIS function with a tripod, your images may be blurred by the vibration of the OIS sensor. Deactivate the OIS function when you use a tripod.
- OIS is not available in the P mode.

Using the Photo Help Guide mode

This mode provides various shooting tips. Learn to get better photos and videos.

1 Rotate the mode dial to 😘.



2 Press [I□I] or [♣] to select a menu.



3 Press [3] and select a submenu.

- 4 Press [3] to view a topic.
 - Press [I□I] or [♣] to display the previous or next screen.




5 Press [**\odots**] to practice.



- Press [4] to go back to the previous menu.
- . While practicing, you cannot set shooting options or menus.

Changing the display type

Press [I|II] repeatedly to change the display type for Shooting and Playback modes.



In Shooting mode

Press [I] once or twice to:

- · display all information about shooting
- hide information about shooting, except the available number of photos



Press $[|\Box|]$ once or twice to display or hide the description for the selected shooting option.



In Playback mode

Press [| | to:

- · display information about the current photo
- hide information about the current file
- hide information about the current photo, except the shooting settings and captured date



Transferring files (for Windows)

Transfer photos, videos, voice memo that you stored on the camera to your PC or transfer multimedia files to the camera so that you can play or view them on the camera. Use the supplied USB cable after installing any programs you need from the CD.

- 1 Insert the installation CD in a CD-ROM drive.
- When the setup screen is displayed, click Samsung Digital Camera Installer to start installation.



- 3 Select programs to install and follow the onscreen instructions.
- 4 Click **OK** to complete the installation.

Connecting the camera to your PC

Once you connect your camera to your PC, the camera will be recognized as a removable disk.



The battery will be charged while the camera is connected to a PC with the USB cable.

1 Plug the USB cable into the camera and your PC.



You must plug the end of the cable with the indicator light (**A**) into your camera. If the cable is reversed, it may damage your files. The manufacturer is not responsible for any loss of data.



- 2 Turn on the camera.
- 3 Select Computer and press [MENU/OK].

Disconnecting the device (for Windows XP)

The way to disconnect the USB cable for Windows 2000/Vista is similar.

- 1 Wait until your PC stops reading from the camera.
 - If the status lamp on your camera is blinking, wait until it is off.
- 2 Click so on the tool bar at the bottom right of your PC screen.



- 3 Click the pop-up message.
- 4 Remove the USB cable.

Transferring files to your PC

- 1 Connect the camera to your PC. (see 'Connecting the camera to your PC')
- 2 On your PC, select My Computer → Removable Disk → DCIM → 100SSCAM.
- 3 Select files and drag or save them to the PC.





Transferring multimedia files to the camera

- 1 Connect the camera to your PC. (p. 21)
- 2 On your PC, select My Computer → Removable Disk.
- 3 Create new folders named 'MP3,' 'PMP,' and 'TEXT.'



- 4 Copy multimedia files to the corresponding folders.
 - MP3 files to MP3 folder
 - SDC files to PMP folder
 - · TXT files to TEXT folder






- Multimedia files cannot be played or viewed if the folder names are incorrect.
- Subfolders nested directly within the MP3, PMP and TEXT folders can be created. Files saved in deeply-nested subfolders may not be played or viewed.
- You can save up to 200 files or 100 subfolders in each folder up to 200 total files and subfolders in combination.
- File names or folder names with more than 120 characters (60 characters for 2-byte languages, such as Chinese or Korean) will not appear on the playlist.





Transferring files (for Mac)

Once you connect the camera to a Macintosh computer, the computer will recognize the camera automatically. You can transfer files directly from the camera to the computer without installing any programs.



- . Mac OS X version 10.3 or later is supported.
- Supported file types and languages are the same as the Windows version. (p.22)
- To use PMP files, you must first convert the files using Samsung Converter on a Windows computer.

Transferring files to your computer

- 1 Connect your camera to a Macintosh computer with the USB cable.
- 2 Turn on your camera.
 - The computer recognizes the camera automatically and a removable disk icon will be displayed.
- 3 Double-click the removable disk icon.
- 4 Transfer photos or videos to the computer.

Transferring multimedia files to the camera

- 1 Connect the camera to a Macintosh computer with the USB cable
- 2 Turn on your camera.
 - The computer recognizes the camera automatically and a removable disk icon will be displayed.
- 3 Double-click the removable disk icon.
- 4 Create new folders named 'MP3,' 'PMP,' and 'TEXT.'
- 5 Transfer multimedia files to your computer.
 - · MP3 files to MP3 folder
 - · SDC files to PMP folder
 - · TXT files to TEXT folder

Shooting modes

Take photos or record videos by selecting the best shooting mode for the conditions.

AUTO Using the Auto mode

Take a photo quickly and easily with minimal settings.

- 1 Rotate the mode dial to **AUTO**.
- 2 Align your subject in the frame and half-press [Shutter] to focus.
- 3 Press [Shutter] to take the photo.

SCENE Using the Scene mode

Take a photo with options for a preset scene.

- 1 Rotate the mode dial to **SCENE**.
- 2 Press [MENU/OK].
- 3 Select → Scene.
- 4 Press [0].
- 5 Press [I□I] or [♣] to select a scene.
 - If you select Nightscene, you can adjust the aperture value and shutter speed.


- 6 Press [MENU/OK].
- 7 Press [Shutter] to return to Shooting mode.
- 8 Align your subject in the frame and half-press [Shutter] to focus.
- 9 Press [Shutter] to take the photo.

(Adjusting the exposure)

If you select **Nightscene**, you can catch brief flashes of light as curved streaks by extending the exposure. Use a slow shutter speed to extend the time until the shutter closes. Increase the aperture value to prevent overexposure.

- 1 Press [Fn].
- 2 Press [I□I] or [♣] to select LT.

3 Press [I□I] or [♣] to select an option.



4 Press [4] or [6] to select the aperture value or shutter speed.



If you select **AUTO**, the aperture value or shutter speed will be adjusted automatically.

5 Press [MENU/OK].



It is a good idea to use a tripod to prevent your photos from blurring.

(I)) DUAL Using the Dual IS mode

Reduce camera shake and prevent blurred photos with Optical and Digital Image Stabilization functions.



Take a photo of a person with options to hide facial imperfections.

- 1 Rotate the mode dial to 1.
- 2 Adjust the brightness of the face and facial imperfection. (see 'Adjusting the brightness of the face' and 'Adjusting facial imperfections')
- 3 Align your subject in the frame and half-press [Shutter] to focus.
- 4 Press [Shutter] to take the photo.



- 6 Press [Shutter] to return to Shooting mode.

P Using the Program mode

Take a photo by setting options.

- 1 Rotate the mode dial to **P**.
- 2 Set options. (For a list of options, refer to Chapter 3 'Shooting options.')
- 3 Align your subject in the frame and half-press [Shutter] to focus.
- 4 Press [Shutter] to take the photo.

Recording a video

- 1 Rotate the mode dial to ₩.
- 2 Set a frame rate or sound option.
- 3 Set other options. (For options, refer to Chapter 3 'Shooting options.')
- 4 Press [Shutter].
- 5 Press [Shutter] again to stop recording.



The zoom sound may be recorded if you use the zoom while recording a video.

Setting the frame rate

A frame rate is the number of frames per second. As the frame rate increases, action appears more natural, but the file size is increased.

- 1 Press [Fn].
- 2 Press [I□I] or [♣] to select FRAME RATE.
- 3 Press [4] or [3] to select a frame rate.
- 4 Press [MENU/OK].

Setting sound options

- 1 Press [MENU/OK].
- Select → Voice Mute.
- 3 Press [(`)].
- 4 Press [□ I] or [□ I] to select an option.







- Press [OIS] to reduce camera shake optically. (p.17)
- Select the (*)) DUAL mode to reduce camera shake both optically and digitally. (p.29)

When shooting in the dark, avoid setting the flash option to

⟨ (Slow Sync) or ((Off). The aperture remains open longer and it may be harder to hold the camera still.

- Use a tripod or set the flash option to \$ (Fill In). (p.41)
- Set ISO speed options. (p. 42)



Preventing your subject from being out of focus

- It is hard to get your subject in focus when:
 - there is little contrast between the subject and background (When your subject is wearing a color of clothing that is similar to the background.)
 - the light source behind the subject is too bright
 - your subject is shiny
 - your subject includes horizontal patterns, such as blinds
 - the subject is not positioned in the center of the frame



Use the focus lock

Half-press [Shutter] to focus. When the subject is in focus, you can reposition the frame to change the composition. When you are ready, press [Shutter] completely to take your photo.

· When subjects are moving fast

Recording voice memos

Record a voice memo that you can play back at any time or add a voice memo to a photo as a short reminder of shooting conditions.



You will get the best sound quality when recording 40 cm away from the camera.

Recording a voice memo


- 1 In Shooting mode (except №), press [MENU/OK].
- 2 Select → Voice Record.
- 3 Press [MENU/OK].
- 4 Press [Shutter] to record.



- Press [] to pause or resume recording.
- You can record a voice memo up to 10 hours.

Selecting a resolution and quality

Selecting a resolution AUTO P ODUAL 'A SCENE PE

As you increase the resolution, your photo or video has more pixels in it, so it can be printed on larger paper or displayed on a larger screen. When you use a high resolution, the file size will also increase.

 - The AF-assist light/Timer lamp will stop blinking just before the camera automatically takes a photo.





Motion Timer may not work when:

- you are more than 3 m away from the camera
- · your movements are too subtle
- · there is too much light or backlight

Shooting in the dark

Preventing red-eye AUTO P () SCENE

If the flash fires when you take a photo of a person in the dark, a red glow may appear in the eyes. To prevent this, select ◆ (Red Eye) or ✔ (Red Eye Fix).






Using the flash AUTO P ' SCENE

Use the flash when taking photos in the dark.

In Shooting mode, press $\mbox{\bf [4]}$ repeatedly to change the flash option.



Option	Description
\$^R (Auto)	The flash fires when the subject or background is dark.
◆ (Red Eye)*	 The flash fires when the subject or background is dark. The camera reduces red-eye.
\$ (Fill In)	The flash always fires.Light intensity is adjusted automatically.

Option	Description
\$ 5 (Slow Sync)	 The flash fires and the shutter stays open longer. Select this in the evening or in the dark. It is a good idea to use a tripod to prevent your photos from blurring.
(Off)	 The flash will not fire. Camera shake warning ((()) is displayed in the dark.
⟨Ked Eye Fix)*	 The flash fires when the subject or background is dark. The camera corrects red-eye through its advanced software analysis.

The options may differ depending on the shooting mode.

* There is an interval between two bursts of the flash. Do not move until the flash fires a second time.



- Flash options are not available if you set burst options or select Self Portrait or Blink Detection.
- Make sure that your subjects are within the recommended distance from the flash. (p. 87)
- If there is reflected light or much dust in the air, tiny spots may appear on your photo.

Adjusting the ISO speed P

ISO speed is the measure of a film's sensitivity to light as defined by the International Organization for Standardisation (ISO). The higher ISO speed you select, the more sensitive to light your camera becomes. With a higher ISO speed, you can get a better photo without using the flash.

- 1 In Shooting mode, press [Fn].
- 2 Press [I□I] or [♣] to select ISO.
- 3 Press [4] or [6] to select an ISO speed option.
- 4 Press [MENU/OK] or [Fn].



- The higher ISO speed you select, the more image noise you may get.
- When Motion Capture is set, ISO speed will be set to Auto.
- \bullet When you set the ISO speed to 3200, the resolution will be set to $3 \, \mathrm{M}.$

Changing the camera's focus

Using macro AUTO P (1) DUAL P

Use macro to take close-up photos of subjects, such as flowers or insects.




- Try to hold the camera very still to prevent blurry photos.
 - Turn the flash off if the distance to the subject is less than 40 cm.

Using auto focus Auto P ODUAL P

To take sharp photos, select the appropriate focus according to your distance from the subject.

In Shooting mode, press $[\mbox{\ensuremath{\mbox{$\mbox{$\mathcal{M}}$}}}]$ repeatedly to change the focus distance option.



Option	Description
(Auto Macro)	Focus on a subject farther than 8 cm (farther than 50 cm, while using zoom).
(Macro)	Focus on a subject between 8 to 80 cm (between 50 and 80 cm, while using zoom).

- To focus on a subject farther than 80 cm, press [♣] repeatedly until no focus distance icon is displayed.
- $\bullet\,$ The options may differ depending on the shooting mode.

Adjusting the focus area AUTO P CONTROL OF SCENE

You can get clearer or photos by selecting an appropriate focus area according to your subject's location in the scene.

- 1 In Shooting mode, press [MENU/OK].
- 2 Select → Focus Area.
- 3 Press [**③**].
- 4 Press [I□I] or [♣] to select an option.

Cen	ter AF	Focus on the center (suitable when subjects are located in the center).

Using face detection Auto P COLL 'S SCENE

If you use face detection options, your camera can automatically detect a human face. When you focus on a human face, the camera adjusts the exposure automatically. Take photos conveniently by using Blink Detection to detect closed eyes or Smile Shot to capture a smiling face.

- 1 In Shooting mode, press [MENU/OK].
- Select → Face Detection.
- 3 Press [**③**].
- 4 Press [I□I] or [♣] to select an option.

Your camera automatically detects human faces (up to ten human faces).

- Face detection may not be effective when:
 - the subject is far from the camera (The focus frame will appear orange for Smile Shot and Blink Detection)
 - it is too bright or too dark
 - the subject is not facing the camera
 - the subject is wearing sunglasses or a mask
 - Face detection is not available when using a photo style, color, staturation, or the digital zoom.
 - When **Smile Shot** or **Blink Detection** is set, the timer is not available.
 - When you use the face detection option, the focus area will be set to Center AF.

Adjusting brightness and color

Adjusting the exposure manually P now P

Depending on the intensity of the ambient light, your photos may be too bright or dark. In these cases, you can adjust the exposure to get a better photo.







Darker (-)

Brighter (+)

- 1 In Shooting mode, press [Fn].
- Press [I□I] or [♣] to select ♠.
- 3 Press [4] or [6) to adjust the exposure.
- 4 Press [MENU/OK] or [Fn].



- . Once you adjust the exposure, the setting will remain the same. You may need to change the exposure value to avoid overexposure or underexposure.
- If you cannot decide on an appropriate exposure, select AEB (Auto Exposure Bracket). The camera takes photos with different exposures: normal, underexposed, overexposed. (p. 50)

Compensating for backlighting P

When the light source is behind your subject or there is high contrast between your subject and the background, your subject is likely to appear dark in the photo. In this case, set the Auto Contrast Balance (ACB) option.

- In Shooting mode, press [MENU/OK].
- Select \bigcirc \rightarrow ACB.
- 3 Press ((')).
- 4 Press [□] or [□] to select On.
 - · To deactivate, select Off.
- 5 Press [MENU/OK].



- The ACB feature is always on in the AUTO and (1) DUAL mode.
- This feature is not available when Continuous, Motion Capture, or AEB is in use.

Changing the metering mode P Open P

The metering mode refers to the way in which a camera measures the quantity of light. The brightness and lighting of your photos will vary depending on the metering mode you select.

- 1 In Shooting mode, press [Fn].
- 2 Press [I□I] or [♣] to select METERING.
- 3 Press [4] or [6) to select an option.

Option	Description
[=] Multi	Your camera divides the scene into several areas, and then measures the light intensity of each area. Suitable for general photos.
[•] Spot	Your camera measures only the light intensity of the very center of the frame. If a subject is not in the center of the scene, your photo may come out too bright or dark. Suitable for a subject with backlighting.
[②] Center Weighted	Your camera averages the meter reading of the entire frame with emphasis placed on the center. Suitable for photos with subjects in the center of the frame.

Selecting a light source (White balance) P (T) DUAL A

The color of your photo depends on the type and quality of the light source. If you want the color of your photo to be the same as what you see, select an appropriate lighting condition to calibrate the white balance, such as Auto WB, Daylight, Cloudy, or Tungsten.













- 1 In Shooting mode, press [Fn].
- 2 Press [□] or [to select WHITE BALANCE.

4 Press [MENU/OK] or [Fn].

3 Press [4] or [5] to select an option.

- 3 Press [4] or [3] to select an option.

Single	Take a single photo.	
Continuous	While [Shutter] is fully pressed down, the camera takes photos continuously. The maximum number of photos depends on the capacity of your memory card.	
Motion Capture	While [Shutter] is fully pressed down, the camera takes VGA photos (5 photos per second; maximum of 30 photos). The camera automatically shows you the photos just taken and then saves them.	

Option	Description
■ AEB	Take three photos with different exposures: normal, underexposed, and overexposed. It is best to use a tripod because it takes some time to save photos taken with AEB.

The options you can select vary depending on the shooting mode.
