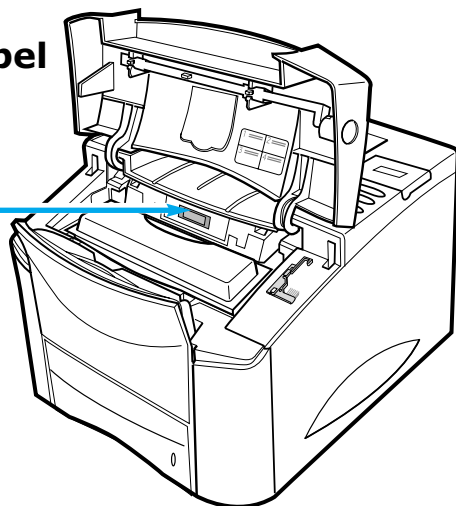

## Replacing the fitted plug (UK Only)

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### ***Important***

The mains lead for this machine is fitted with a standard (BS 1363) 13 amp plug and 13 amp fuse. When you change or examine the fuse, you must re-fit the correct 13 amp fuse. You then need to replace the fuse cover. If you have lost the fuse cover, do not use the plug until you get another fuse cover from the people who sold you the machine.

The 13 amp plug is the most widely used type in the UK. However, some buildings (mainly old ones) do not have normal 13 amp plug sockets. You need to buy a suitable plug adaptor. Do not remove the moulded plug.

### ***Warning***

**If you cut off the moulded plug, get rid of it straight away. You cannot rewire the plug or you may get an electric shock if you put it into a socket.**

**Important warning: You must earth this machine.**

The wires in the mains lead use the following colour code:

Green and Yellow	: Earth
Blue	: Neutral
Brown	: Live

If the wires in the mains lead do not match the colours marked in your plug, do the following:

You must connect the blue wire to the pin which is marked with the letter 'N' or coloured black.

You must connect the brown wire to the pin which is marked with the letter 'L' or coloured red.

You must have a 13 amp fuse in the plug, adaptor, or at the distribution board.

# *Introduction*

Congratulations on the purchase of your ML-7300 series printer! This chapter provides information on the following topics:

- ◆ Safety Precautions
- ◆ Features and Model Descriptions
- ◆ Printer Components

Before using the printer, please read the instructions in this guide carefully and put the guide in a safe place close to the printer, so that it is available when you need it later. Please take the following precautions when using and maintaining your printer.

- Unplug the printer before cleaning it. Do Not use any liquid or aerosol cleaners. Simply use a damp cloth. Refer to the page of this guide for further details.
- Do Not place the printer on an unstable surface or close to a radiator or source of heat.
- Take care not to block or cover the ventilation holes on the side of the printer. Do Not insert any object in these holes.
- Check that the electrical power source to which you wish to connect the printer complies with the electrical specifications of this printer :  
**(100 ~ 240V) - Power cord may differ from one country to another.**
- Connect all your computer equipment, including the printer to a power point with earthing device. Avoid plugging your printer into the same power point as equipment likely to cause voltage variations, such as a photocopying machine or an air conditioner.
- Check regularly that the power cable is in good condition and is not damaged in any way.
- If you use an extension cord, check that total intensity of all equipment connected to it does not exceed the maximum intensity allowed for the extension cord. Check that the total intensity of the equipment connected to the same power point does not exceed 15 amps.
- Unless otherwise indicated in this guide, do not attempt to repair the printer yourself. Should you detect a fault, return your printer to an authorized service center or your dealer.
- Systematically return your printer to an authorised service center or your local dealer if one of the following situations occurs :
  - The power cord or plug is damaged.
  - A liquid has been spilled on and/or in the printer.
  - The printer has fallen or been dropped or the bodywork is damaged in any way.
  - The printer is not operating correctly or you have noticed a significant drop in the quality of the printing.

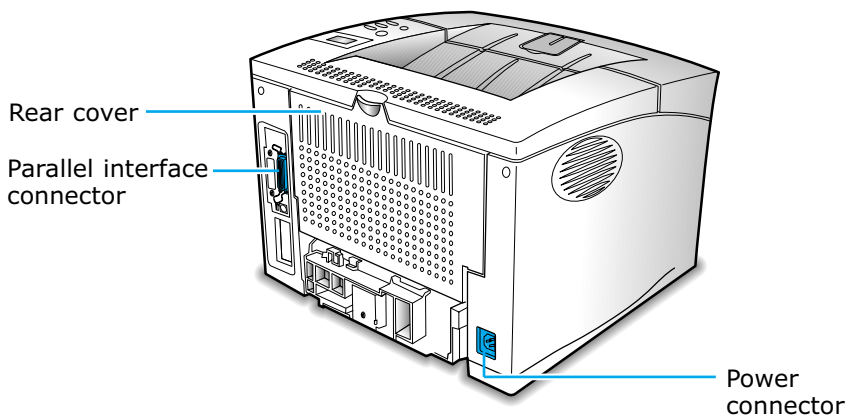

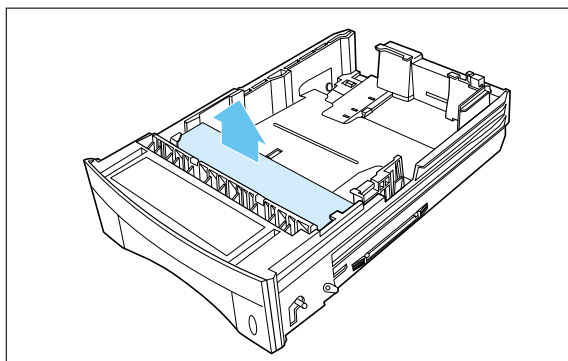
### Preparation

During the storage and transport of your printer, adhesive tape is used to block some of the elements that may move or open unexpectedly and consequently be damaged.

- 1 Before connecting up your printer and starting to use it, you must remove all the adhesive tapes, as illustrated in the figure below.



- 2 Slide the tray out of the printer. Remove the packaging material from the tray.

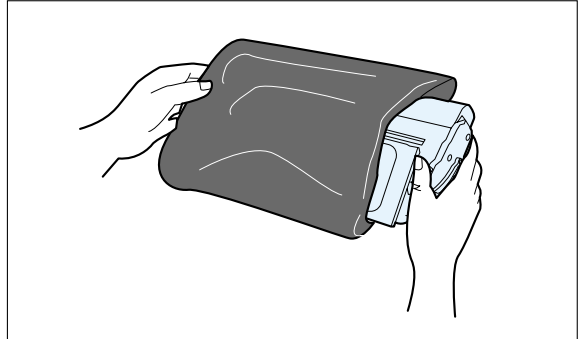


# Installing Toner Cartridge

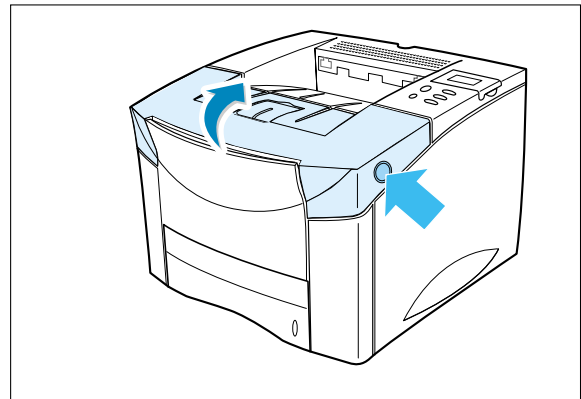
To install a toner cartridge in your printer proceed as follows.

- 1 Remove the toner cartridge from its packaging.

- Notes:**
- Do not remove the cartridge from its packaging until you are ready to use it.
  - Do not expose the cartridge to light, it could damage the cartridge permanently.

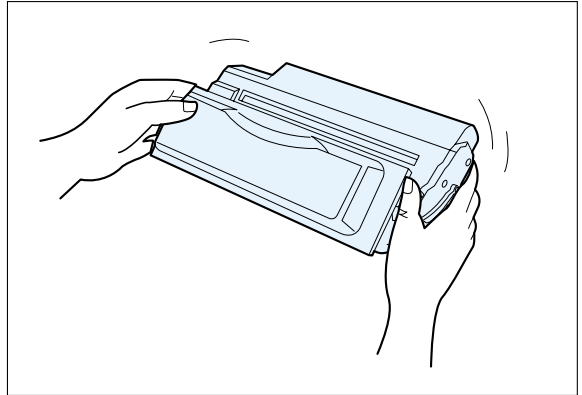


- 2 Open the top cover of the printer by pressing the button on the right side of the printer.

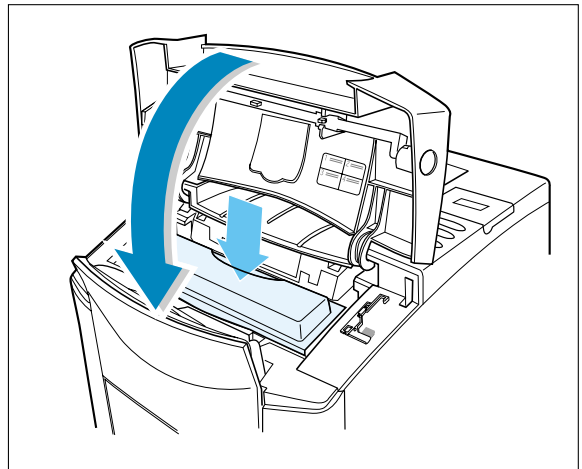


## Installing Toner Cartridge

- 3 Rotate the cartridge and gently shake it from side to side to distribute the toner evenly inside the cartridge.



- 4 Position the cartridge as shown with the arrow pointing into the printer. Slide the cartridge into the printer as far as it will go.

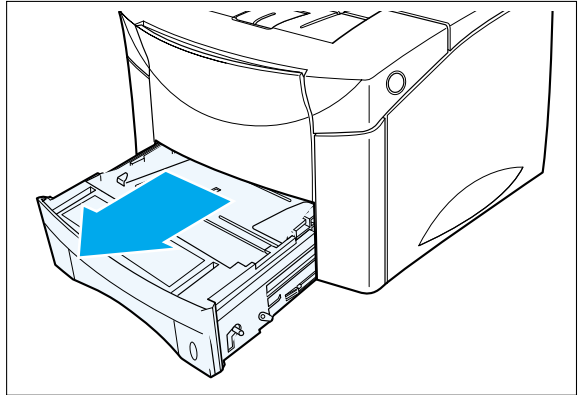


- 5 Close the top cover.

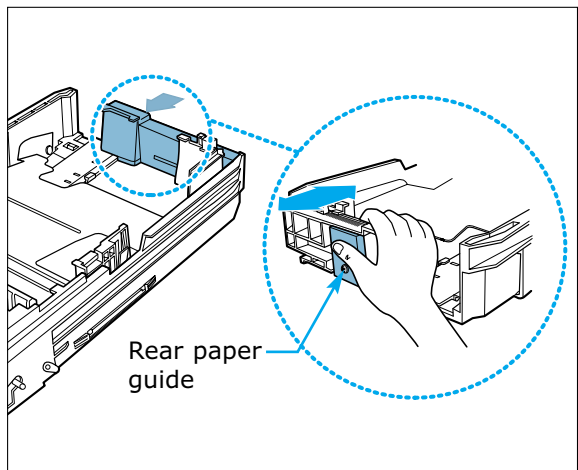
**Notes:** *If toner gets on your clothing, wipe it off with a dry cloth and wash clothing in cold water. When printing text at 5% coverage, a toner cartridge lasts an average of 10,000 pages in simplex mode.*

To load paper in the tray, proceed as follows.

- 1 Pull the Tray1 completely out of the printer.

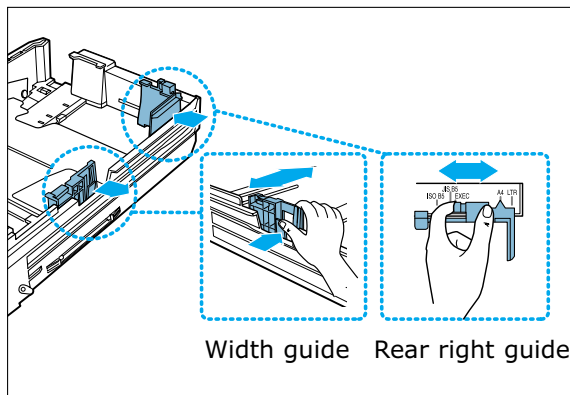


- 2 Squeeze the back of the rear paper guide and slide it to the desired paper size until it clicks into place.  
The paper sizes are indicated on the bottom of the tray1.



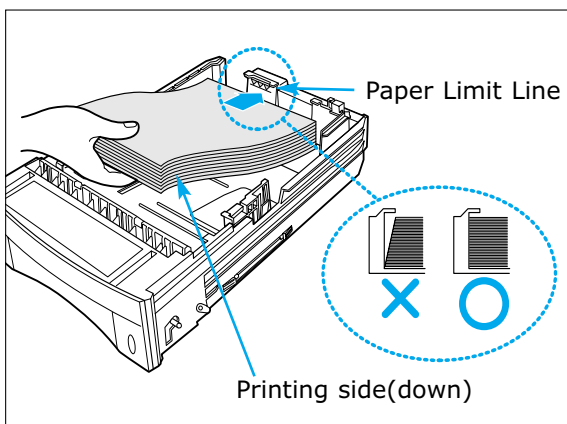
## Load Paper

- 3 Lift the rear right guide and slide it to match the width of the paper. The paper sizes are indicated on the bottom of the tray.
- 4 Squeeze the width guide and slide it to the far right side of the tray.



**Notes:** *If the tray is not properly adjusted, the printer might display an error message or paper might jam.*

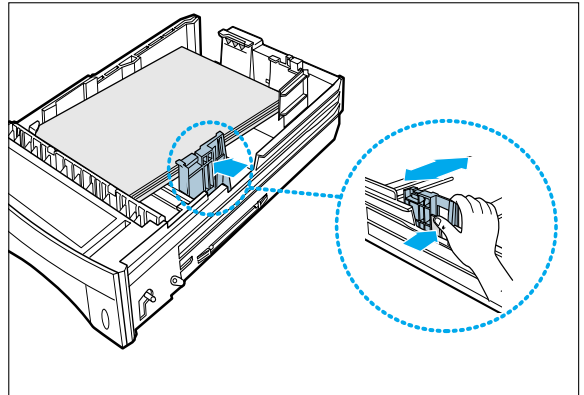
- 5 Place the paper against the rear paper guide as shown.



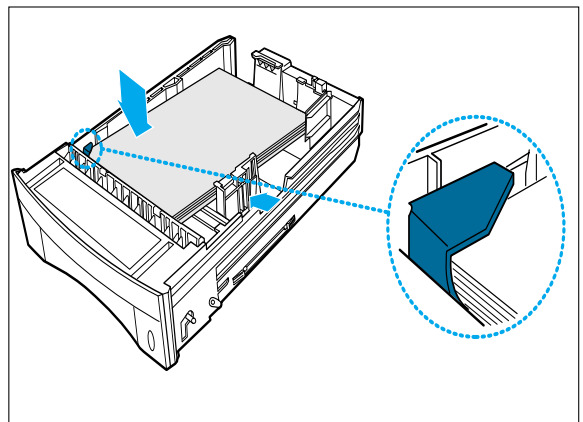
**Notes:**

- Do not fold or crease the paper.
- Place the paper with the recommended print side face down.
- Don't exceed the paper limit line indicated on the tray.

- 6 Squeeze the width guide and slide it to the left until it lightly rests against the edge of the paper.

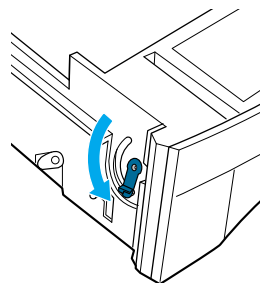


- 7 Make sure the paper is under the tab on the tray.



- 8 Gently slide the tray back into the printer. The printer automatically senses the size of paper loaded if the tray1 is adjusted correctly.

**Notes:** If jam 0 often occurs when 24lb letter, legal or folio size paper is used, push down the lever on the left side of the tray as shown in the figure to ensure proper paper feeding.





# Connecting the Parallel Cable

To print from computer software, you need to connect your printer to your computer with a parallel interface cable.

## Cable Specifications (Not provided)

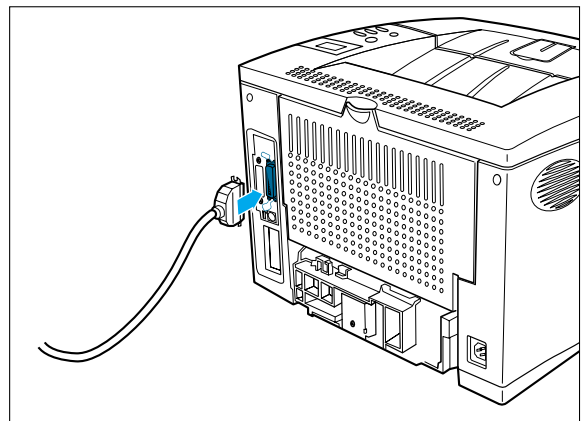
The parallel cable should be compatible with the Centronics® parallel interface and IEEE standard 1284. If you purchase a parallel cable, ensure that it :

- Is compatible with Centronics interface.
- Supports bi-directional communications(IEEE standard 1284).
- Is shielded.
- Has the appropriate connector :
  - 25 pin D-Sub connector on the computer side.
  - Amphenol 36 connector on the printer side.

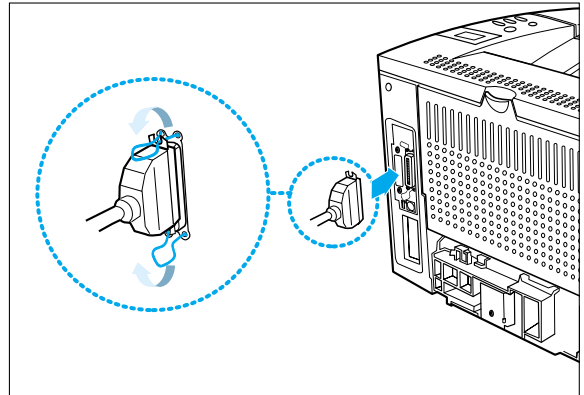
## Connecting the Parallel Cable

To connect the printer to your computer use a parallel cable and proceed as follows.

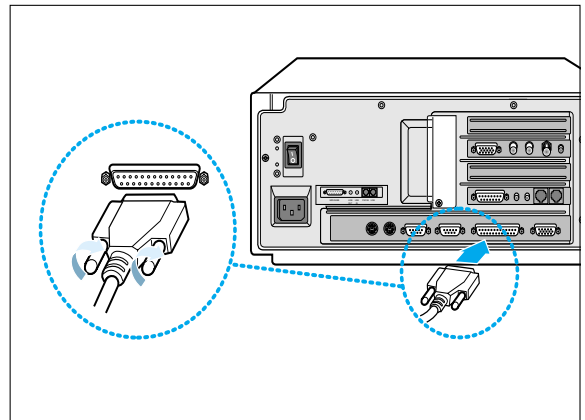
- 1 Check that both the printer and the computer to which it is to be connected are powered off and disconnected from the power point.
- 2 Plug the appropriate end of the parallel cable into the connector on the rear of the printer.



- 3 Push the clip at each end of the connector down into the notches on the plug as shown.



- 4 Plug the other end of the cable into the appropriate parallel connector on your computer and tighten the screws.

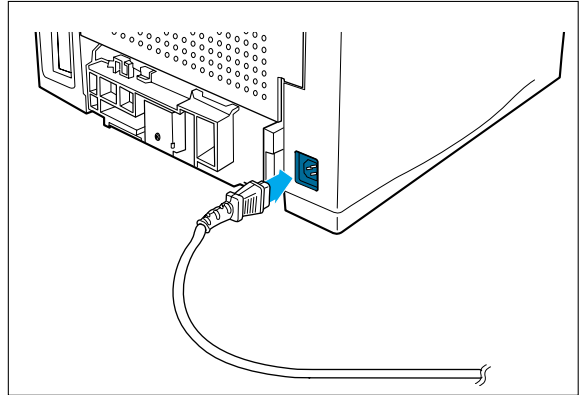

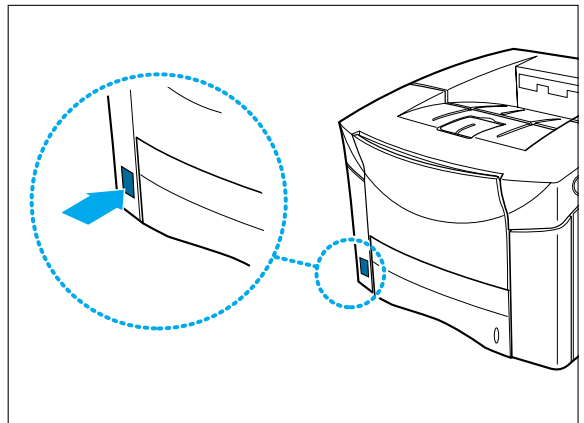
## Connecting the AC Power Cord

To connect the printer to a power point, proceed as follows.

- 1 Plug the appropriate end of the supplied power cable to the connector on the rear of the printer.
- 2 Plug the other end into a suitable power point.
  - **Power cord may differ from one country to another.**



- 3 Power the printer on by pressing the power on/off button.



**Result:** *You will hear some movement inside the printer.  
The printer enters the Ready state.*

Print a configuration page to make sure the printer is operating correctly.

- 1 Make sure that the READY status message appears on the display.



- 2 Press On Line.

**Result:** *The OFFLINE message appears on the display and the printer is off-line.*



- 3 Press Menu > or < Menu to enter the menus.

- 4 Press Menu > or < Menu one or more times until the TEST MENU message is displayed.



- 5 Press Item> or <Item one or more times until the SELFTEST message is displayed.



- 6 Press Enter to print.

**Notes:**

- *The message 'PRINTING PCL6' appears and remains on the display until the page prints.*
- *The printer returns to the Ready state after printing.*

# Setting Up the Printer Driver

The printer drivers provided on the CD must be installed to take full advantage of the printer's features.

Printer drivers access the printer features and allow the computer to communicate with the printer.

If you install the printer driver using the CD, PCL 6 is installed.

The CD includes the following printer drivers.

- PCL 6
  - You can use the PCL 6 driver in Windows 95, Windows 98, Windows NT 4.0 and Windows 2000.  
The PCL6 driver supports Watermark, Overlay, N-Up and Poster printing.
- Postscript.
- Font Navigator.
- Linux Driver.

- Notes:**
- *You cannot use PostScript in Windows 3.1.*
  - *PCL 6 is the combination of the PCL 5e driver and the new PCLXL printer language.*

## Installing the Driver

### Hardware Requirements

To install and run the PCL printer driver, you must have the following minimum hardware configuration.

- Windows 95 or Windows 98
  - PC-compatible 486 computer or better.
  - 32MB RAM
  - 200MB available hard-disk space.
- Windows NT 4.0 or Windows 2000
  - PC-compatible pentium 133MHz computer or better.
  - 64MB RAM
  - 650MB available hard-disk space.
- CD-ROM Drive.

### Software Requirements

To install and run the printer driver, you must be running one of the following platforms.

- Windows 95, Windows 98, Windows NT 4.0, Windows 2000.
- Macintosh System 7.5 or later.

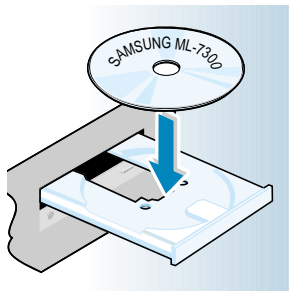
### Install Procedure

To install the printer driver on your hard disk, make backup copies of the print driver CD. Keep the original CD in a safe place and use the copies.

**Notes: I do not have a CD-ROM driver**

*If you have access to another computer with a CD-ROM drive, you can use the Make diskette utility in Windows to create the disks you need for the installation. Go to Appendix E, "Installing Software from Diskettes"*

## Installing the Printer Software from the CD-ROM

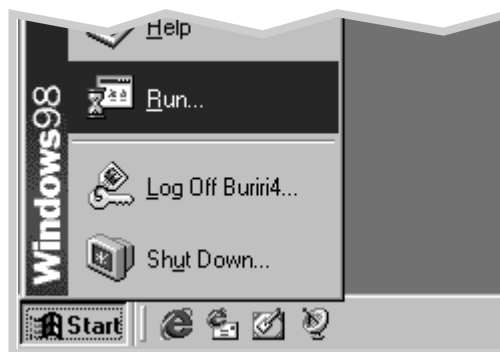


- 1 Place the CD-ROM in the CD-ROM drive. Install will start automatically.

### If the CD-ROM drive does not automatically run:

Select **Run** from the **Start** menu, and type **x:\cdsetup.exe** in the Open box (where **x** is the drive letter for the CD-ROM drive), and then click **OK**.

**Notes:** If the *New Hardware Found* box appears during the installation procedure, click the **X** in the upper right corner of the box, or click **Cancel**.



- 2 When the opening screen appears, select the appropriate language.
- 3 Click **Install the Samsung Software-I on your PC**.



- 4 Follow the instructions on the screen to complete the installation.

**Notes: To Install Shared Win 95/98 Printer Driver from NT Server to Client PC**

- 1 Select **Sharing** in **Properties** of the printer driver.
- 2 Select **Windows 95** in **Alternate Drivers**.
- 3 Type **D:\7300\XX\pcl\pcl6\win9x**  
(Where "D" is your CD-ROM drive letter and XX is the language code\*,  
i.e. **eng** for English).
- 4 Install the network printer in the client PC.  
\* Refer to "language code" (page 2.17) for language codes.

## Uninstalling the Printer Driver

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An uninstall utility is supplied with the printer driver to enable you to remove the driver and all associated files from your hard disk, if so required. To uninstall the driver, proceed as follows.

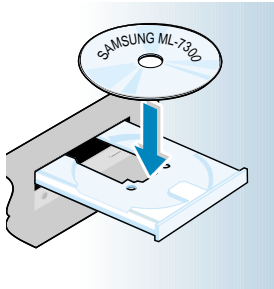
Select **Start** → **Programs** → **Samsung ML-7300** → **Samsung ML-7300 Driver uninstall** from the windows task bar.

- The PCL 6 driver is removed from your hard disk.



# Installing the Font Navigator (FontNav)

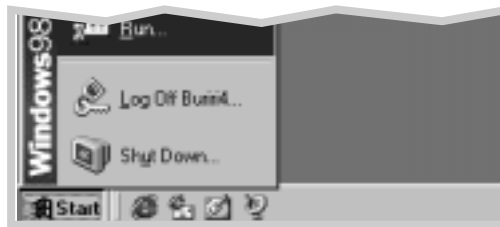

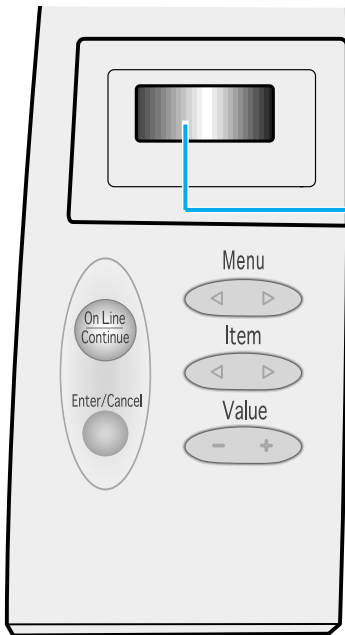

# Operator Panel Buttons

## LCD panel

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The operator panel, on the front right side of your printer, has a 2-line LCD(Liquid Crystal Display) and five buttons.

## Using Panel Buttons

Use the five operator panel buttons to open a menu, scroll through a list of values, change printer settings, and respond to printer messages. The following table describes the functions of each button.

Button	Function
On Line/Continue	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Places the printer either online or offline.</li> <li>Allows the printer, to continue printing when the printer is in recoverable error state.</li> </ul>
Enter/Cancel	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Cancels the print job that the printer is processing when the printer is online.</li> <li>Saves the selected value for that item when the printer is offline.</li> </ul>
Menu	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Cycles through the operator panel menus.</li> </ul>
Item	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Cycles through the selected menu's items.</li> </ul>
Value	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Cycles through the selected menu item's values.</li> </ul>

## Operator Panel Menus

A number of menus are available to make it easy for you to change printer settings. Some menus are displayed only if a specific option is installed in the printer. When you select a new setting from the operator panel, the asterisk(\*) moves next to the selected setting to identify it as the current user default setting.

**Notes:** *Changes made from a software application override the user default settings made from the printer operator panel.*

# Changing Printer Setting

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To change an operator panel setting, proceed as follows.

- 1 Make sure the 'READY' message appears on the display.
- 2 Press On Line.

**Result:** *The 'OFFLINE' message appears on the display and the printer is off-line.*

- 3 Press Menu until the menu you need appears on the display.
- 4 Press Item until the menu item you need appears on the display.
- 5 Press Value until the setting you need appears on the display.
- 6 Press Enter to save the selection.

**Result :** *An asterisk(\*) appears beside the current user default setting for that menu item.*

A value can be :

- A phrase or word that describes a setting.
- A numerical value that you can increase or decrease.
- An On or Off setting.




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

- 14 Set the IP address of the WINDOWS pc running SyncThru in step1. For example, if the IP address is 155.213.211.12, follow these steps:
- a Press **Item** until **SV-IP B1** appears on the display.
  - b Press **Value** until **155** appears on the display.
  - c Press **Enter/Cancel**.
  - d Press **Item** until **SV-IP B2** appears on the display.

**Notes:** After the "Completed. Network Card will start about 30secs later" message is displayed on SyncThru, click OK. It may take a few seconds to write the new file to Firmware. Normally 30 seconds is sufficient.

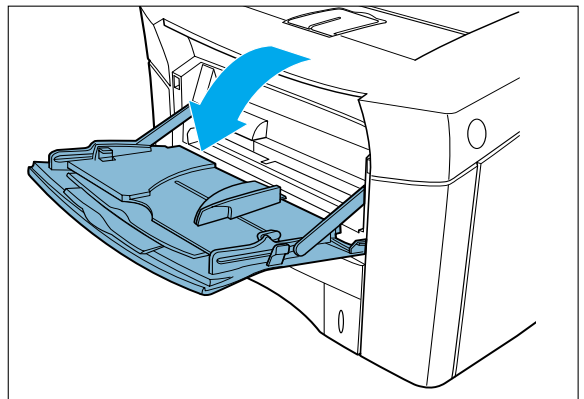
# Loading Paper

## Using the Multi-Purpose Tray

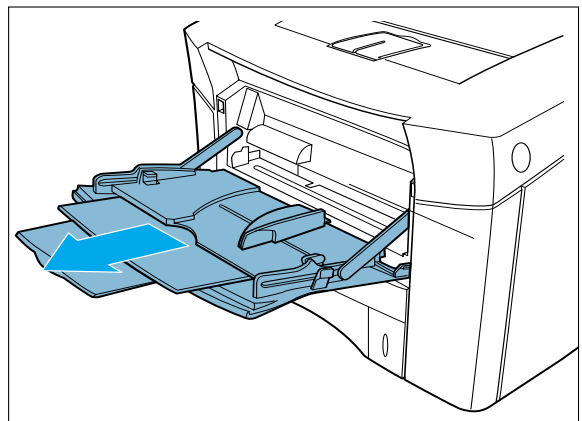
Multi-Purpose tray provides a convenient way to print envelopes, transparencies, or other type of media without having to unload the other tray.

To load paper in the Multi-Purpose tray, proceed as follows.

- 1 Pull the Multi-Purpose tray towards you.

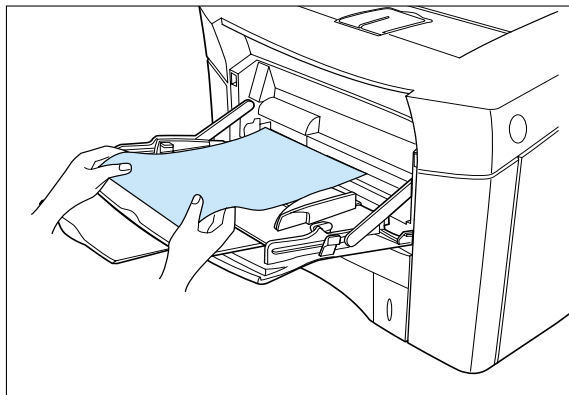


- 2 Slide the length guide out toward you.



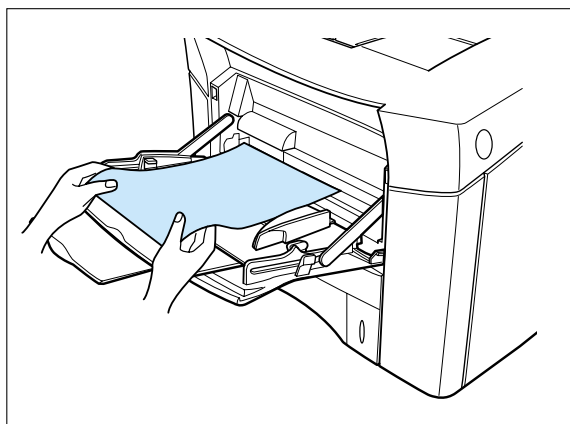


- 3 Flex the sheets back and forth to loosen them, then fan them.

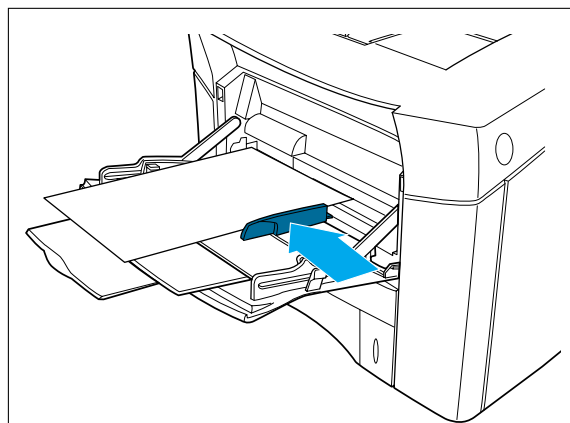


- Notes:**
- Do not fold or crease the paper.
  - Place the paper with the recommended print side face up.

- 4 Place the paper against the side of the Multi-Purpose tray with the recommended print side face up and the top edge going in first toward the printer as shown.



- 5 Adjust the paper guide to the size of the paper inserted by pushing the guide.



## Using the Manual Feed

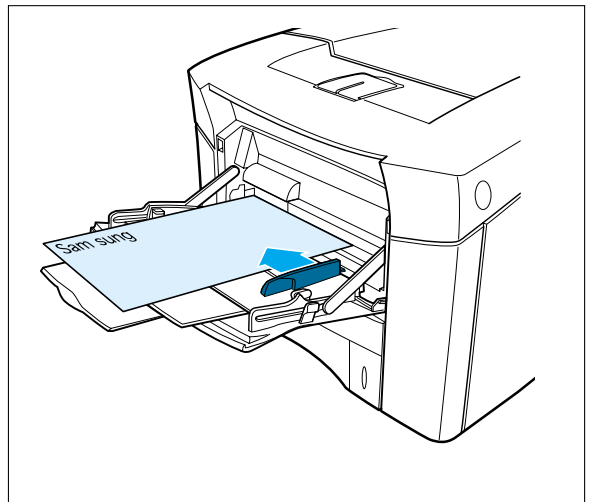
The Manual Feed feature allows you to print from the Multi-Purpose tray onto special media such as envelopes or letterhead.

If the Tray menu item is set to Manual, the printer will print only from the Multi-Purpose tray.

Manual Feed can be selected through the software or printer driver too.

# 4

- 1 Select Manual as the paper source.
  - Set the source item in the properties dialogue box to Manual.
  - You can select Manual as the paper source by setting the Tray item using the operator panel menu.
- 2 Print your document.
- 3 Place a sheet of paper in the Multi-Purpose tray.
- 4 Press continue key when you are prompted.



### Letterhead / Prepunched Paper

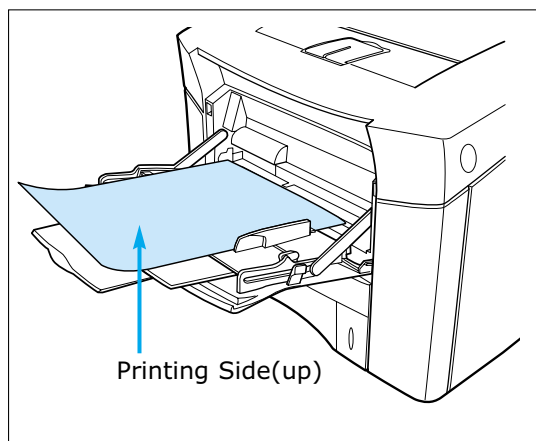
Special paper includes letterhead, prepunched, envelopes, labels, and transparencies.

When printing letterhead and prepunched paper, it is important to load the trays with the correct orientation.

#### For Multi-Purpose tray,

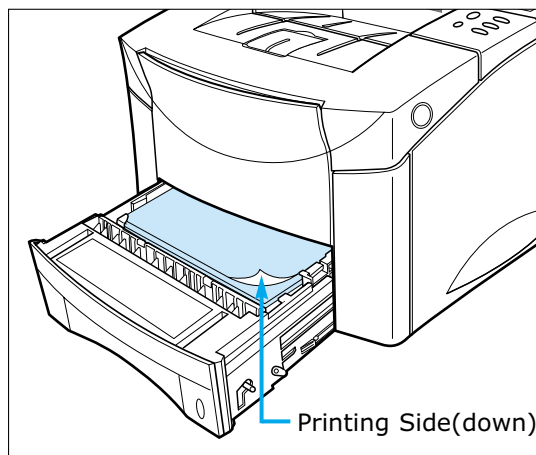
Load the paper with the side-to-be-printed facing up, and the top, short edge toward the printer.

- Set the source item in the properties dialogue box to Manual or MP.
  - To print continuously from Multi-Purpose tray, set the source item to MP.
  - To print a sheet of paper from Multi-Purpose tray, set the source item to Manual.



#### For ALL other trays,

Load paper with the side-to-be-printed facing down, and the top, short edge toward you.



## Envelopes

Many types of envelopes can be printed from the Multi-Purpose tray. The types of envelopes are COM-10, MONARCH, DL, C5 and C6(60~90g/m<sup>2</sup>). The printer will automatically feed up to 10 envelopes. Printing performance depends on the construction of the envelope.

### Printing information

- Set margins at least 0.6inch(15mm) from the edge of the envelope.
- Always test a few sample envelopes before purchasing large quantities.
- Select THICK paper for better quality.

### Envelopes guidelines

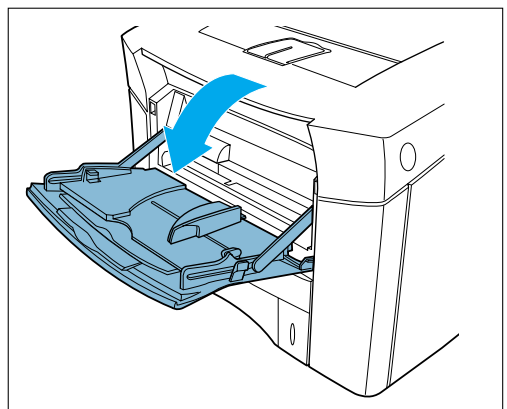
For best performance, use envelopes made from 75g/m<sup>2</sup>(20lb bond) paper.

Do not use envelopes that :

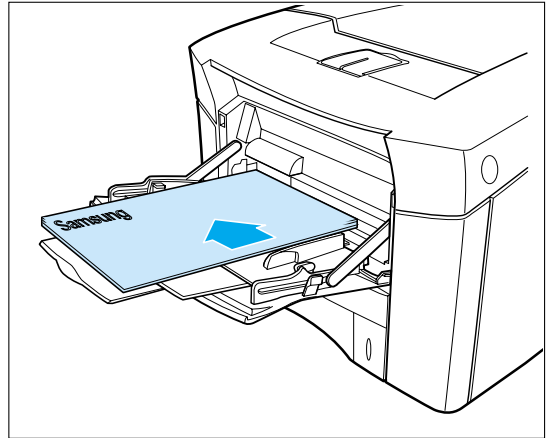
- Are damaged in any way.
- Use metal claps, string ties, metal folding bars.
- Contain windows, holes, cutouts or embossing.
- Have exposed flap adhesive when the flap is in the sealed or closed position. For envelope specifications, see page Appendix A.4.

### Loading envelopes

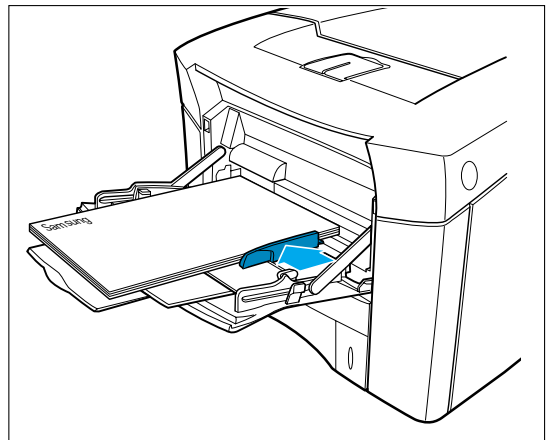
- 1 Open the Multi-Purpose tray.  
Pull out the extension.



- 2 Load up to 10 envelopes in the left side of Multi-Purpose tray with the side-to-be printed facing up, and the postage-end toward the printer.

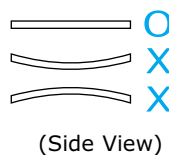


- 3 Adjust the guide to touch the envelope stack without bending the envelopes.



- 4 Set the source item in the properties dialogue box to Manual or MP.

**Notes:** Do not use an envelope curled down side, refer to the figure.



## Label

Labels automatically feed from the Multi-Purpose tray or the other trays.

### Label guidelines

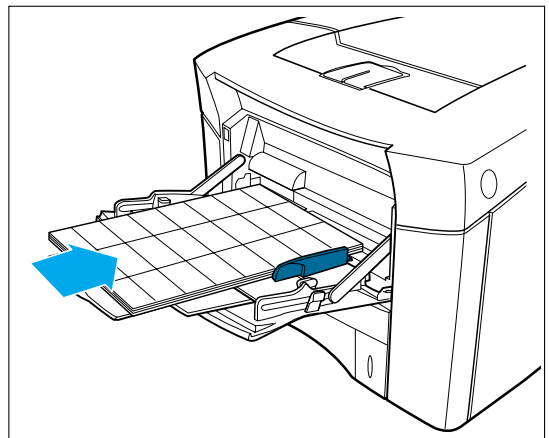
Make sure that labels meet the specifications for the tray you use.

- Use full label sheet. Partial sheets may cause labels to peel off during printing, resulting in a paper jam.
- The adhesive material should be stable at 400°F(205°C), the printers maximum temperature.
- Do not use labels that have the backing sheet exposed.

**Notes:** *Do not print on both sides of labels.*

### Label orientation

- For Multi-Purpose tray, load the labels with the side-to-be-printed facing up, and the short edge toward the printer. Print a stack of 25 labels from Multi-Purpose tray.



## Transparencies

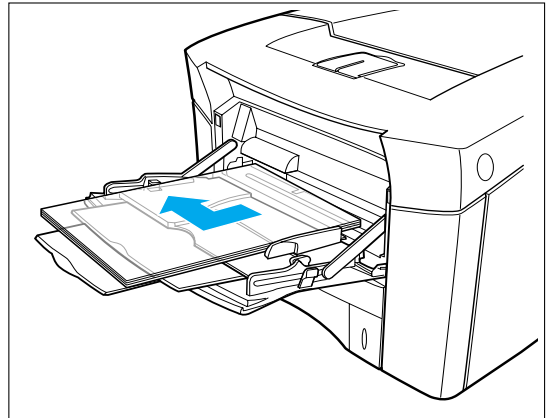
Transparencies automatically feed from the Multi-Purpose tray or the other trays. Some brand of transparencies may require manual feeding. The Multi-Purpose tray is a tray that holds up to 25 sheets of A4 or Letter size paper.

### Transparencies guidelines

- Use only transparencies recommended for use in laser printers.
- Place transparencies on a flat surface to cool after removing them from the printer.

### Transparencies orientation

- For Multi-Purpose tray, load the transparencies with side-to-be-printed facing up, and the top toward the printer. Print a stack of 25 transparencies from the Multi-Purpose tray.



- Notes:**
- *Because transparencies are heavier than paper, do not load the trays to capacity.*
  - *Remove each transparency from the output bin before printing another.*

  - For duplex printing, it is recommended to print less than 1,500 pages a day to keep a good image quality.

# Toner Cartridge

**Toner cartridge storage** Do not remove the toner cartridge from its package until you are ready to use it.

**Notes:** *To prevent damage to toner cartridge, do not expose it to light.*

**Toner cartridge life** The life of the toner cartridge depends on the amount of toner that print jobs require. When printing text at 5% coverage, a Samsung toner cartridge lasts an average of 10,000 pages in simplex mode, depending on which toner cartridge is installed. This assumes that print **DENSITY** and **ECONO** menu items are set to default.

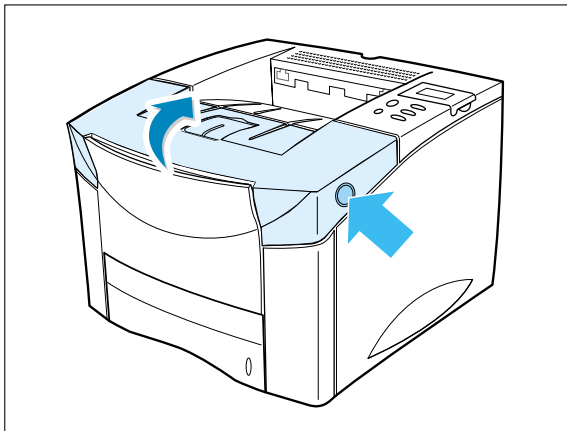
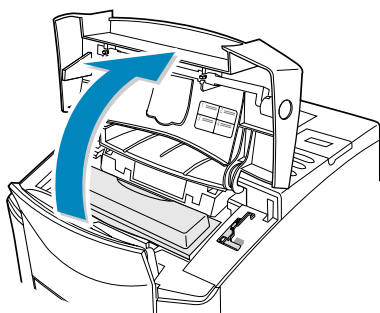
**Distributing the Toner** When toner is low, faded or light area might appear on a printed page. You might be able to temporarily improve print quality by distributing the toner.



### Redistributing Toner

When toner is low, faded or light areas may appear on a printed page. You may be able to temporarily improve print quality by redistributing the toner. The following procedures may allow you to finish the current print job before replacing the toner cartridge.

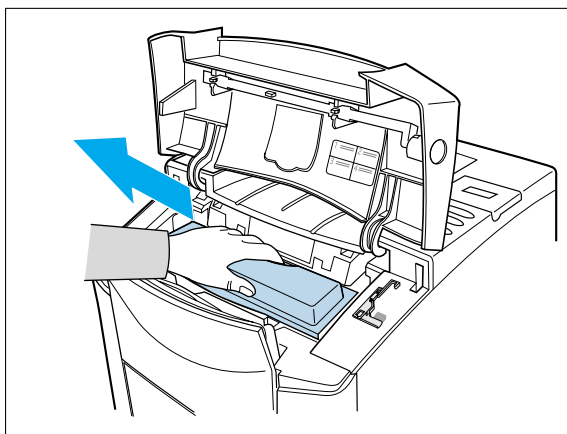
- 1 Open the top cover by pushing the button on the side of the printer.



- 2 Remove the toner cartridge from the printer.

#### CAUTIONS:

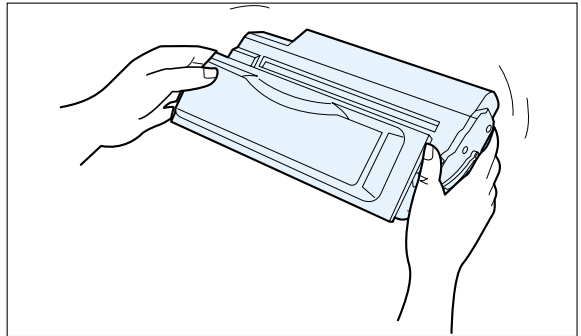
- Avoid reaching too far into the printer. **The fusing area may be hot.**
- To prevent damage to the toner cartridge, **do not expose it to light for more than a few minutes.**



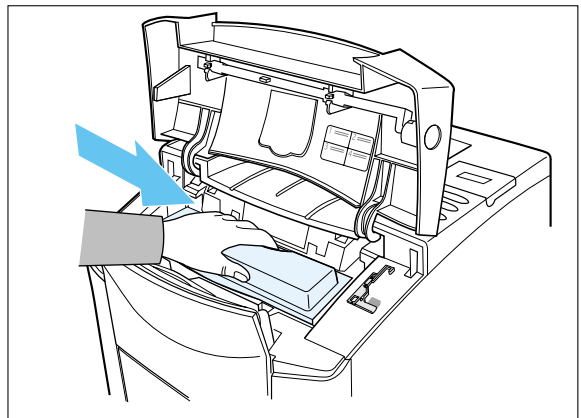
- 3 Gently shake the toner cartridge from side to side 5 or 6 times to redistribute the toner.

**Notes:** *If the toner gets on your clothing, wipe it off with a dry cloth and wash clothing in cold water.*

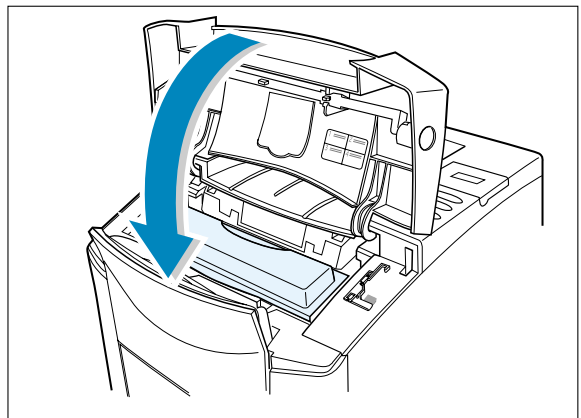
**Hot water sets toner into fabric.**



- 4 Reinsert the toner cartridge into the printer. Be sure that the toner cartridge is firmly in its place.



- 5 Firmly close the cover.



### If the print remains light

Remove the old cartridge and install a new toner cartridge. See "Installing Toner Cartridge" on page 2.3.

# Cleaning the Printer

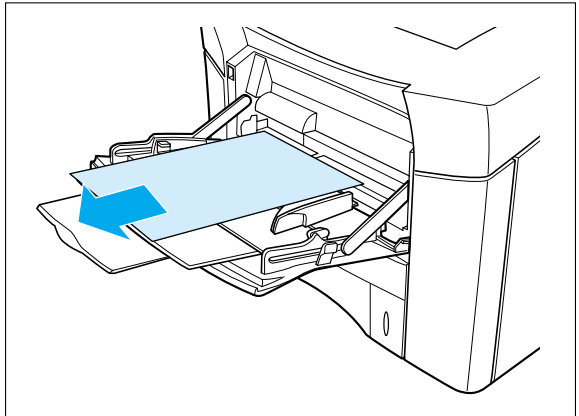
To maintain print quality, you should clean the printer.

- Never use alcohol or solvent based cleaning agents to clean the printer as they may damage the printer casing and components.
- Never use a hard-bristled brush or abrasive pad.

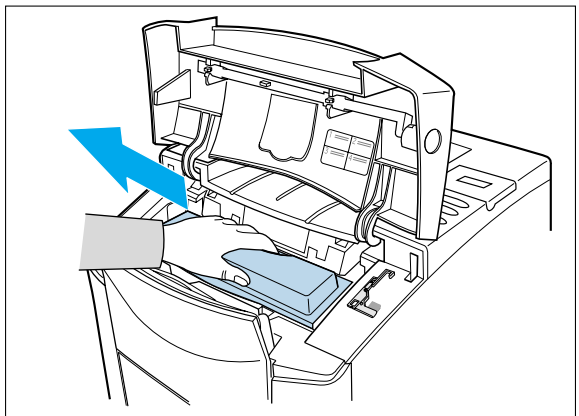
**To clean your printer, proceed as follows.**

**1** Check that the printer is powered off and disconnected from the power point.

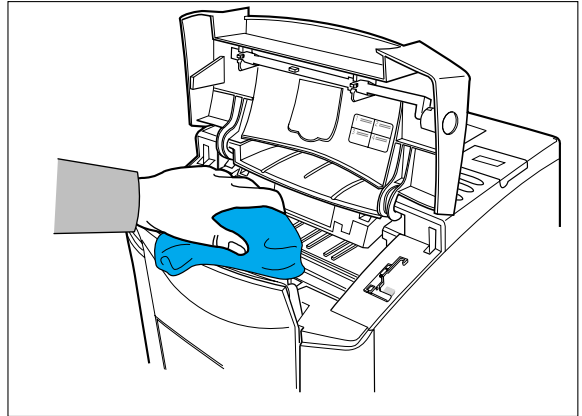
**2** Remove the paper from Multi-Purpose tray.



**3** Open the top cover and remove the toner cartridge.



- 4 Use a soft cloth to remove any dust.



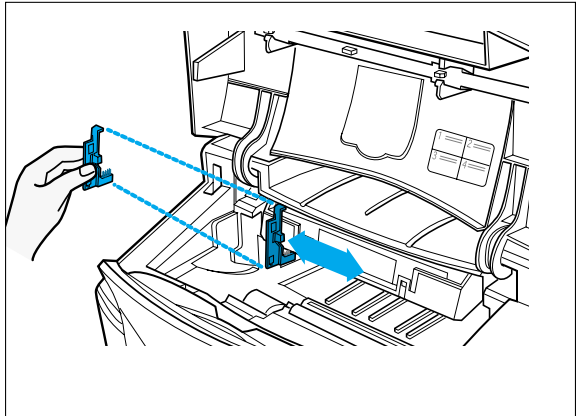
- 5 If the outer casing or the paper feed guides are dirty, clean them with a soft, clean cloth, slightly dampened with a gentle detergent.
- 6 Clean the inside of the printer with a damp cloth.
- 7 Replace the toner cartridge, close the top cover, plug in the power cord, and turn the printer on.

**Notes:** *While cleaning the printer, be careful not to touch the transfer roller (the black, rubber roller, located underneath the toner cartridge). Skin oils on the roller can cause print quality problems.*

# Cleaning LSU

To obtain high quality from your printer, clean the **LSU(Laser Scanning Unit)** when characters have lines running through them.

- 1 Open the top cover and remove the toner cartridge.
- 2 Pull up on the LSU cleaner and put it on the LSU.
- 3 Slide the LSU cleaner horizontally across a track on the top of the LSU.



**Notes:** For more information on using method, see attached label on the inside of the top cover.

### 4 The Copy to Floppy dialog box appears.

Select the desired components you want to copy to the diskette from the Select box. You can select PCL Printer Driver, PostScript Driver.

Select the floppy disk drive you will use to insert the diskette.



### 5 Click **Copy all disk images**.

If you want to copy a portion of the selected component, select the disk you want to copy in the Disk Images window, then click **Copy selected disk image**.

### 6 When prompted, insert a blank, formatted diskette into the floppy drive, and click **Yes** to copy the first diskette. For multiple diskettes, when the first diskette is finished, you are prompted to insert disk 2.

Make sure you label each diskette in order as you create it: PCL Printer Driver, disk 1 of 2, etc.

- 7 If you have more than one disk, insert the next disk and click **Yes**. Repeat this step for a third disk if necessary.
- 8 When the diskettes have finished copying, click **Close** in the Copy to Floppy dialog box. Then click **Exit** in the SAMSUNG PRINTER SETUP dialog box.

# Installing Software from Diskettes

The instructions to install PCL Printer Driver, PostScript Driver are same. Take the following steps:

- 1 Insert the first diskette (if the selected software diskettes are more than one) which contains the desired installation software; PCL Printer Driver, PostScript Driver.
- 2 From the **Start** menu, select **Run**.
- 3 Type **A:\setup.exe** in the Open box and click **OK**. (if your floppy drive is not **A**, substitute the correct letter).
- 4 Follow the on-screen instructions to complete the installation.

# Precautions

## Disconnect The Power Cord

---

Never remove the printer control board while the printer is plugged in.

To avoid the possibility of electrical shock, always disconnect the power cord when installing or removing ANY internal or external printer option.

## Discharge Static Electricity

---

The control board and internal printer options (SIMM, Network interface) are sensitive to static electricity. Before installing or removing an internal option, discharge static electricity from your body by touching something metal, such as the metal back plate on any device plugged into a grounded power source. If you walk round before finishing the installation, discharge any static electricity again.

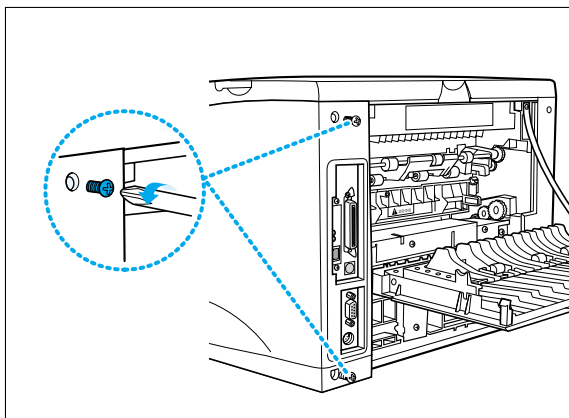


# Preparations

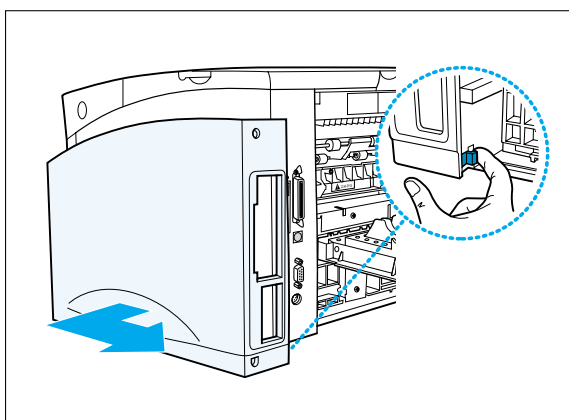
Complete the following steps before you install the printer options.

- 1 Unplug the printer power cord.
- 2 Disconnect all cables from the back of the printer.

- 3 Remove the printer cover.
  - a Open the rear cover.
  - b Remove the two screws from the back of the printer. Save the screws.



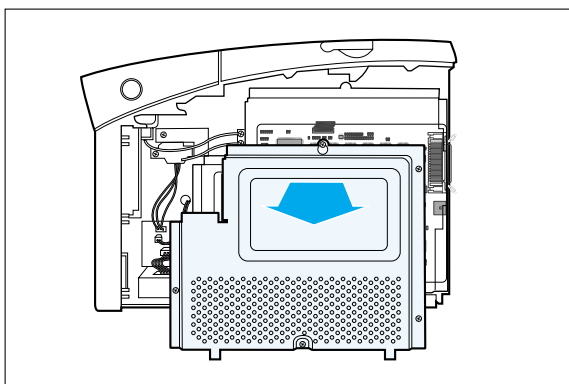
- c Grasp the cover (as illustrated) and pull it firmly toward the rear of the printer until it stops.



- d Remove the cover from the printer.

- e Remove the five screws from the metal plate covering the control board.

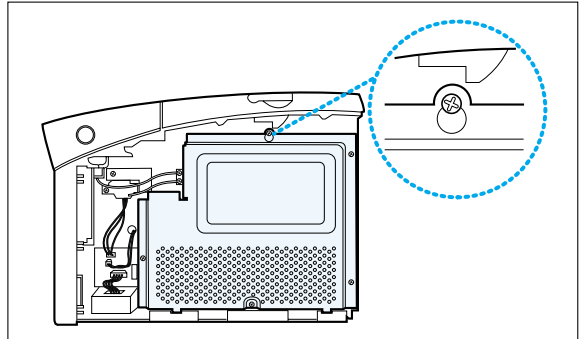

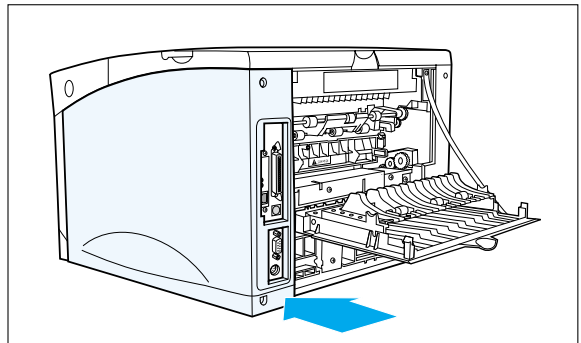
# Closing The Printer Cover

When you have finished installing an Option, follow these steps.

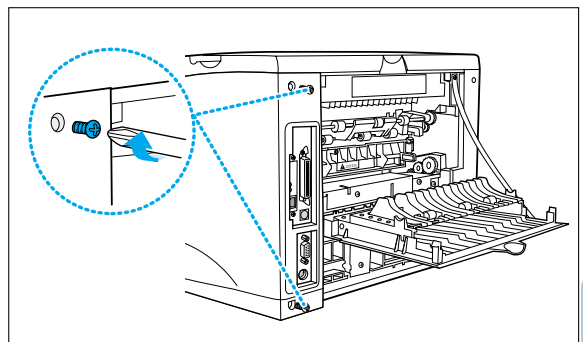
- 1 Close the metal plate and tighten all the screws.



- 2 Set the bottom of the cover onto the printer. Make sure the bottom tabs on the cover fit into the corresponding slots in the printer. Rotate the cover up towards the printer. Slide the cover toward the front of the printer until it clicks into place.



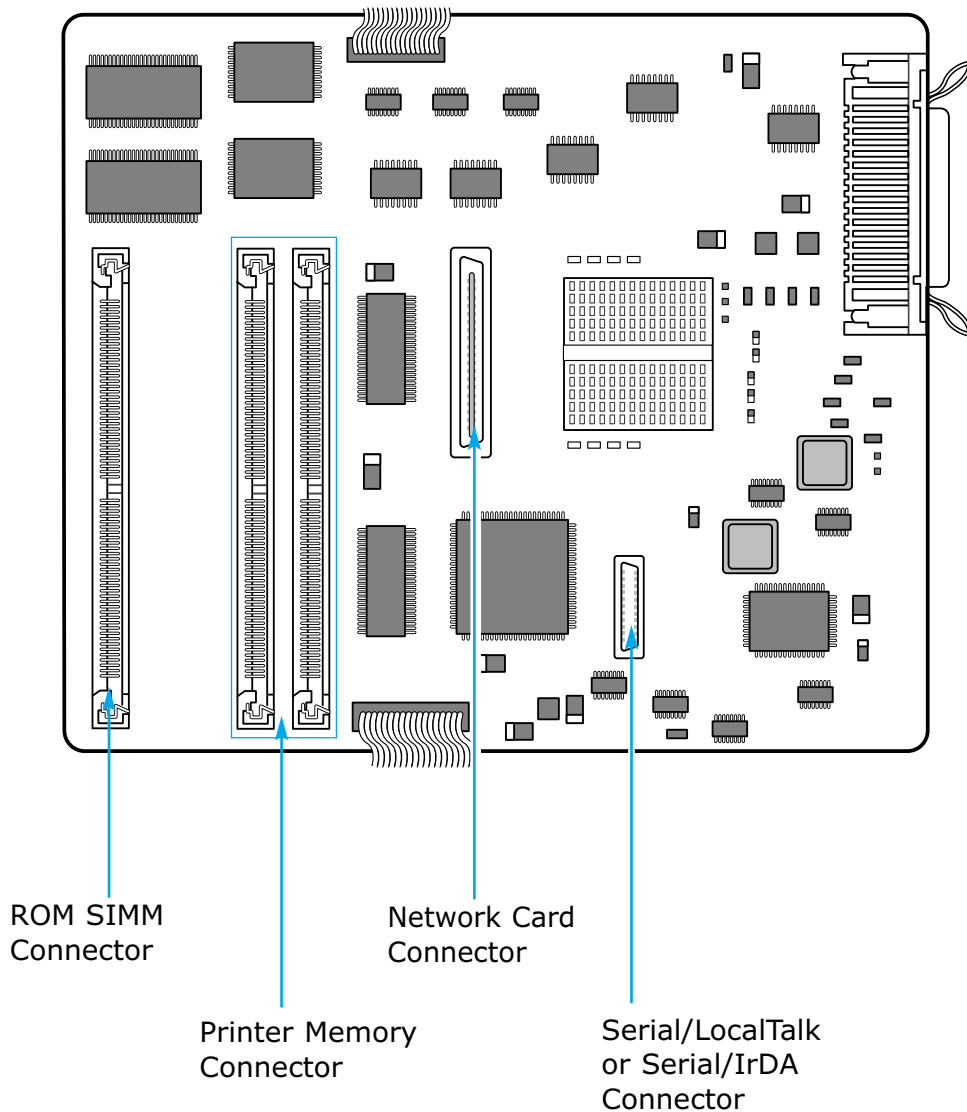
- 3 Gently tighten all the screws.

# Printer Memory

The printer memory option increases the printer's dynamic random access memory (DRAM).

Your printer was shipped with 16MB of standard printer Memory.

You can install two printer memory options in your printer. Printer memory upgrade options available are 4, 8, 16, 32, 64 and 128MB.

**Notes:** *Your machine recognizes only half of 8MB, 32MB and 128MB SIMMs if installed in the slot CN 4.*

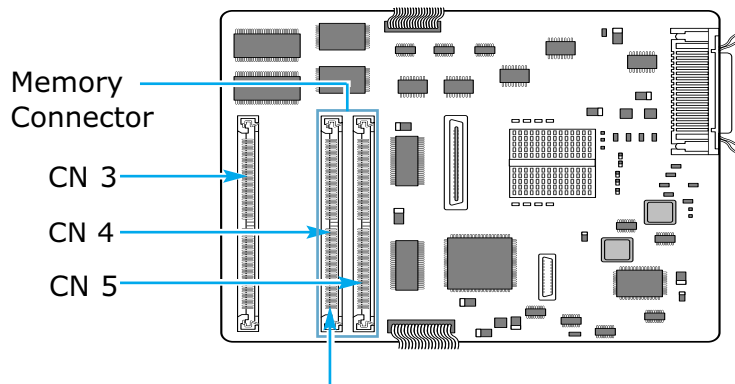

- 1 Before you install the printer memory option, follow steps under 'Preparations' on page F.2.

**Notes:** *The printer memory option is easily damaged by static electricity. Touch something metal before you touch the memory option.*

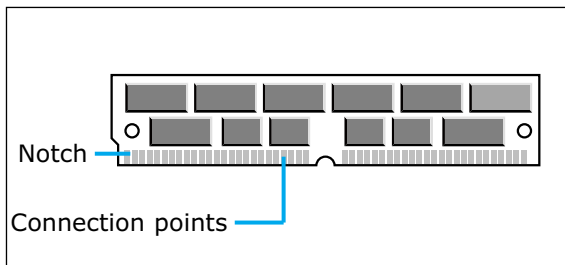
- 2 Remove two screws and remove the metal plate in the direction of the arrow.



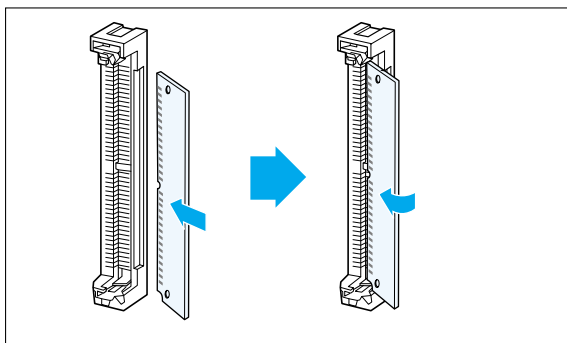
**CN 4:** *This slot recognizes only half of 8MB, 32MB and 128MB SIMMs if they are installed.*

### 3 Unpack the memory option.

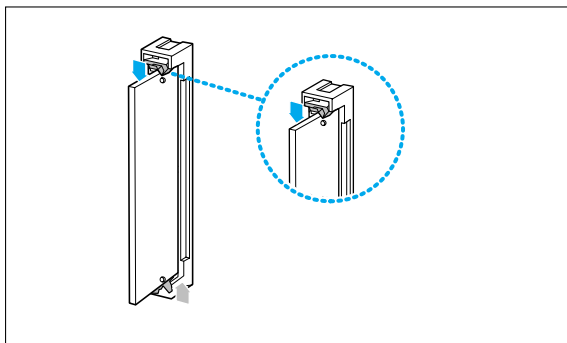
**Notes:** *Avoid touching the connection points along the edge. Save the packaging.*

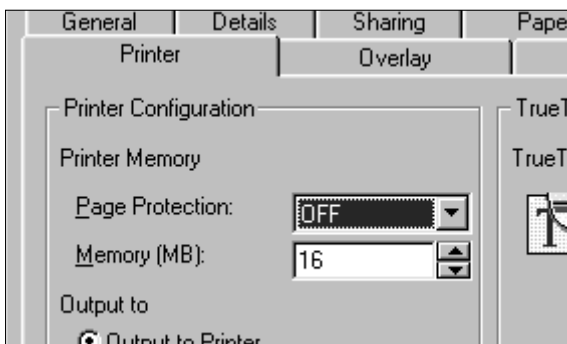

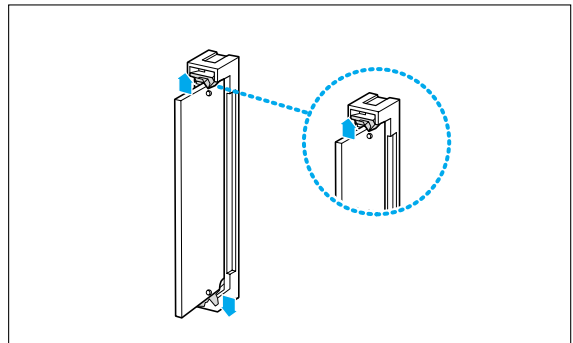

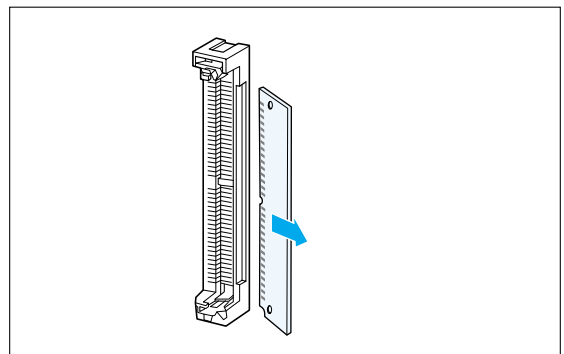
## Removing the Printer Memory Option

Complete the following steps if you need to remove a printer memory option before you install a new one.

- 3 Place the printer memory option in its original packaging.

**Notes:** *If you did not save the packaging, wrap the memory option in paper and store it in a box.*

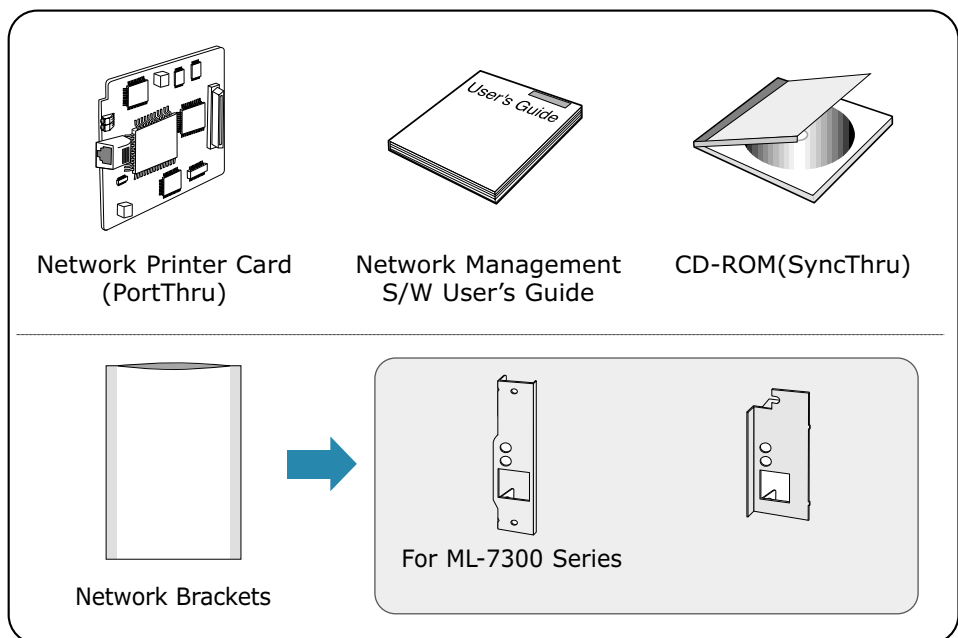

## Package Contents

When unpacking the network printer card, you should find the following items.

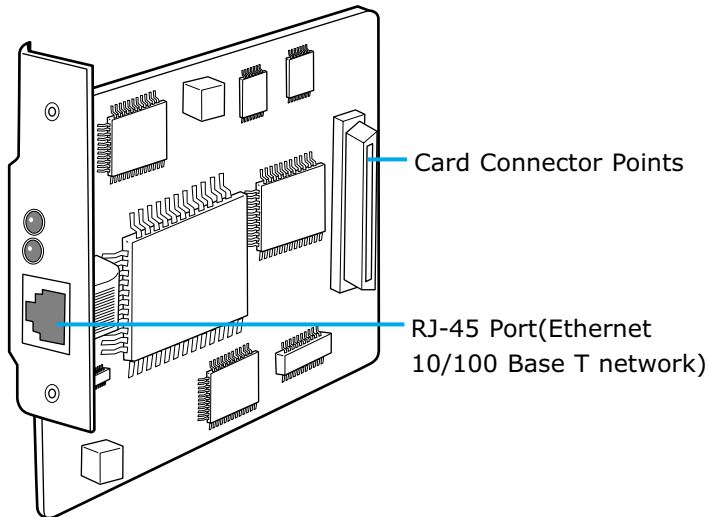

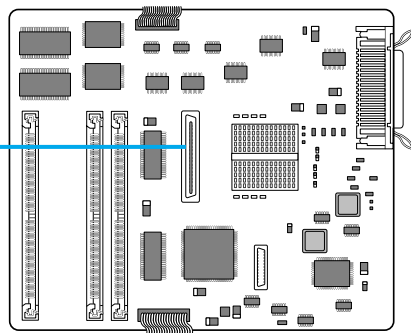
## Installing Procedure

The network option card lets you connect the printer to a local area network(LAN).You can install one network option card in your printer.



- 1 Before you install the network option card, follow steps under 'preparations' on page F.2.
- 2 Locate the card connector on the printer control board.

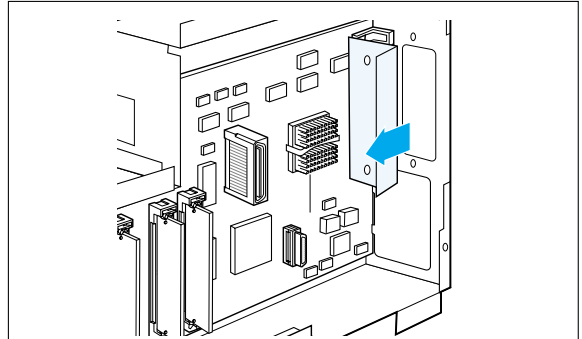
Network card connector





- 3 Remove the two screws from the metal plate covering the opening for cable connector.

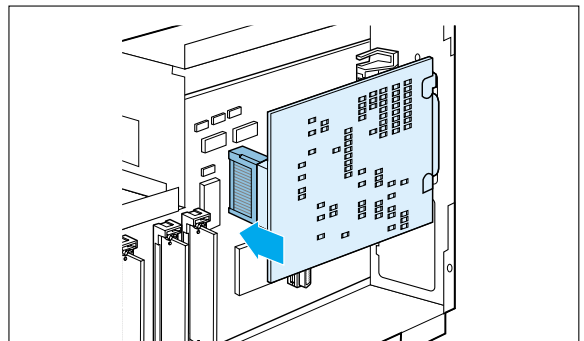

**Result:** *The two connectors should fit snugly together.*

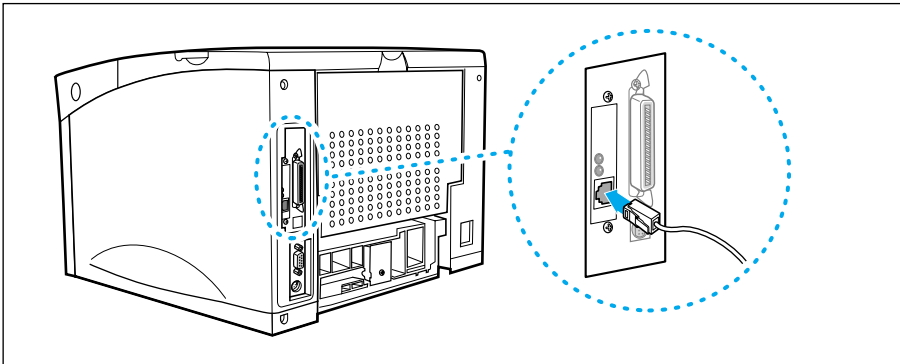

## Connecting a Printer to the Network

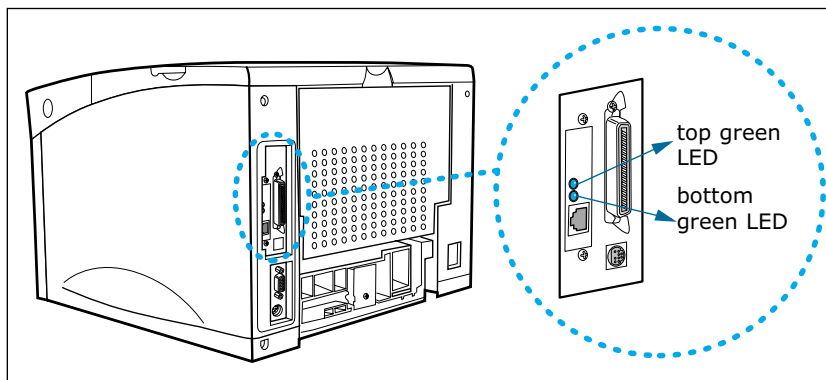
Use standard network cabling that is used for other network components. Make sure the printer is turned off before connecting the network cable to the port.

Attach the twisted-pair network cable to the RJ-45 port (10/100 Base T) on the card.



## Powering Up

- 1 Connect the printer power cable into a properly grounded electrical outlet.
- 2 Turn on the printer.



### Notes:

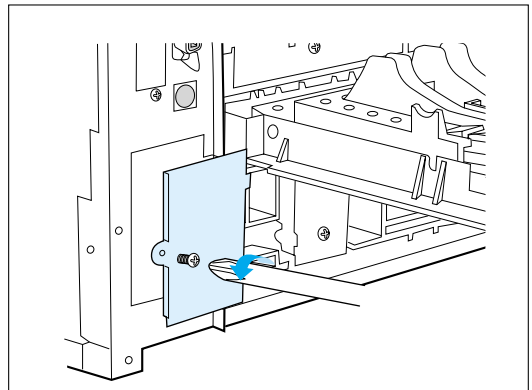
- The top green LED comes on when the cable is connected to the port on the Network Printer Card.
- After booting, the bottom green LED should blink irregularly and the top green LED should come on continuously. If the bottom green LED blinks regularly, turn on your printer again.

# Installing Serial/LocalTalk or Serial/IrDA option card

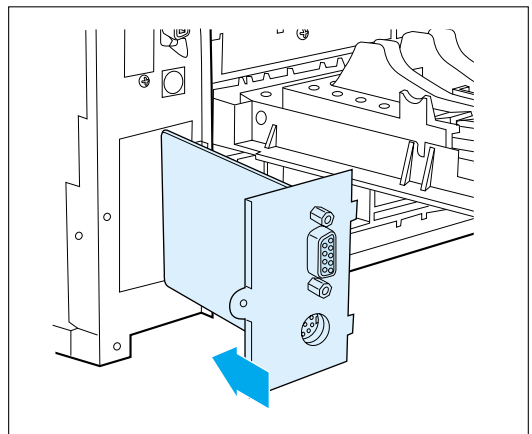
- 1 Before you install the Serial/LocalTalk or Serial/IrDA option card, follow steps under 'Preparations' on page F.2.
- 2 Locate the Serial/LocalTalk or Serial/IrDA connector on the printer control board.

- 3 Remove the single screw that fastens the metal plate covering the cable connector opening.

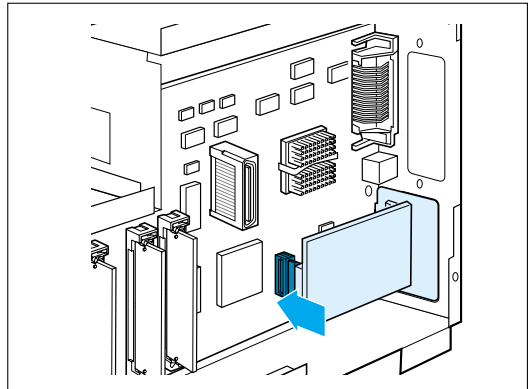

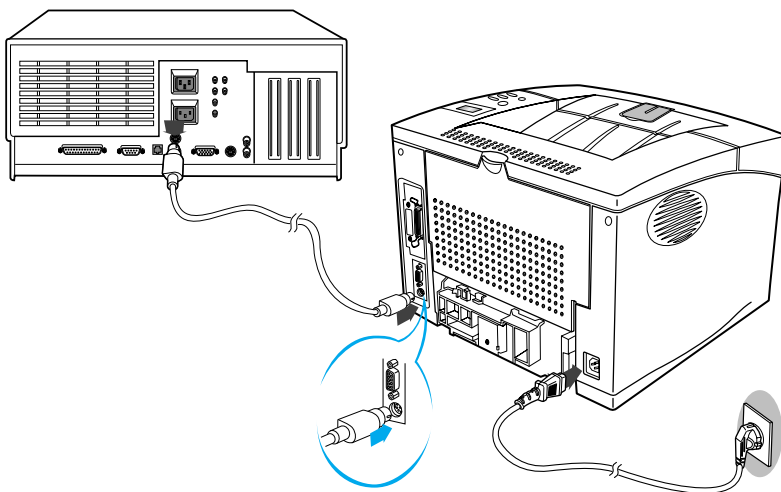

# Serial/IrDA

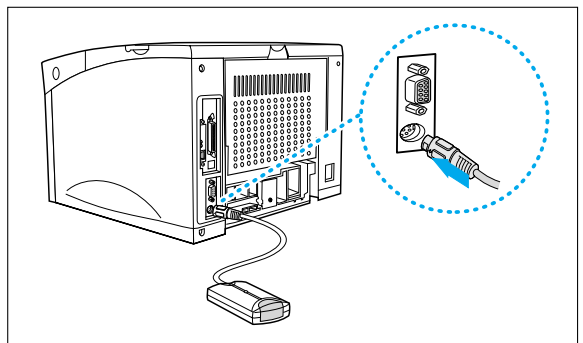
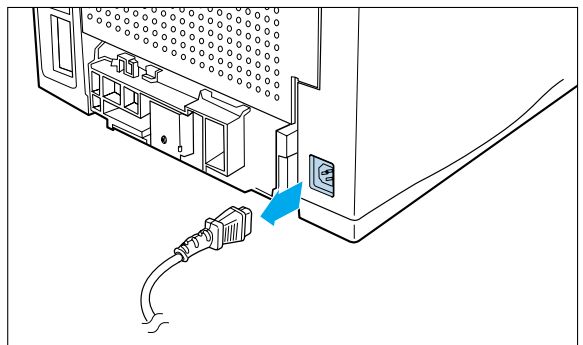
You can use an infrared adapter to print remotely from an IrDA-Compatible computer equipped with an infrared port.

The infrared port is compliant with the specifications established by the Infrared Data Association(IrDA).

The infrared port operates transmitting data at speeds up to 115.200 bits per second.

## Connecting the Infrared Apapter

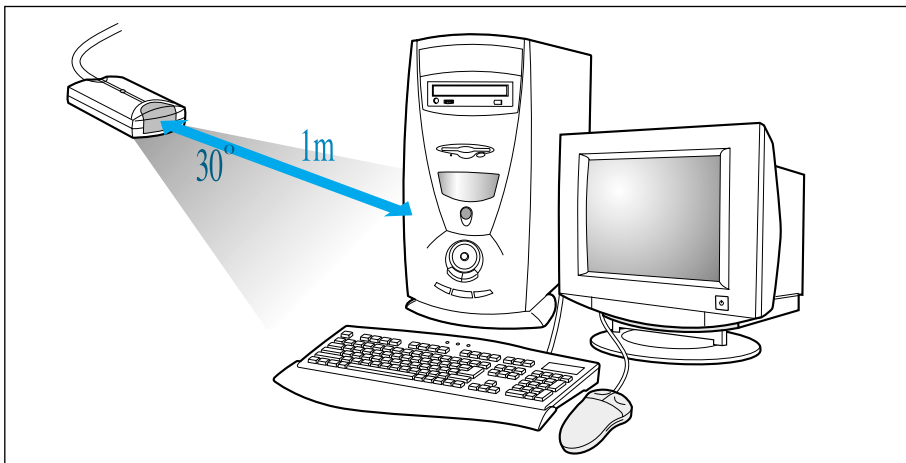
- 1 Make sure the printer power cord is unplugged.
- 2 Locate the infrared port on the back of your printer.
- 3 Plug the adapter cable into the infrared port.
- 4 Reconnect the power cord.



**Result:** *The green light on the infrared adapter comes on when the printer is plugged in.*

## Using the Infrared Apapter

- 1 To print with an infrared port, you should install an infrared port driver on your computer.
  - If you do not have the driver, please ask your PC manufacturer.
  - You can download the infrared driver for Windows 95 from the internet with no charge (<http://www.microsoft.com>).
- 2 Aim the computer infrared port at the infrared port on the back of the printer.
- 3 Aim the infrared port on your computer within 15 degrees of either side of the line as shown.



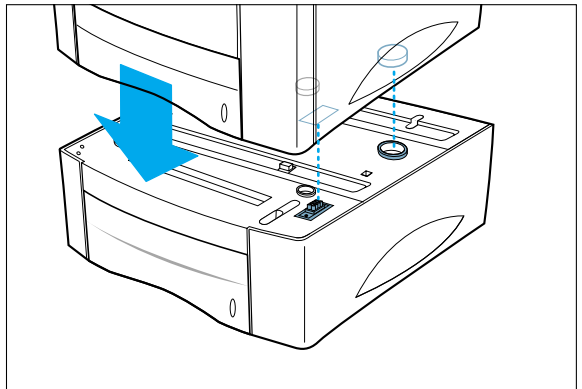
- 4 The printer must be within 3 feet(1 meter) of the computer.
- 5 Make sure the printer is in ready state.
- 6 Send the print job from the computer.

# Optional Tray 2

You can install an Optional Tray 2. Complete the following steps before you install the Optional Tray 2.

- Unplug the printer power cord.
- Disconnect all cables from the back of the printer.

- 1 Carefully place the printer on top of the Optional Tray 2 unit.
  - Make sure the connector is properly inserted.



- 2 Reconnect all cables to the back of the printer.
- 3 Reconnect the power cord to the printer.
- 4 Make sure the 'READY' message appears on the operator panel display.

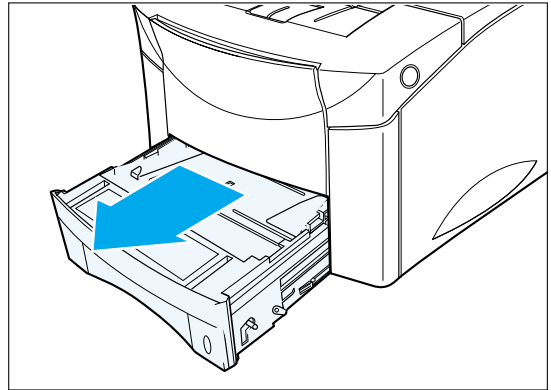

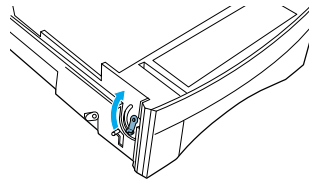

To load paper in the Optional Tray 2, proceed as follows.

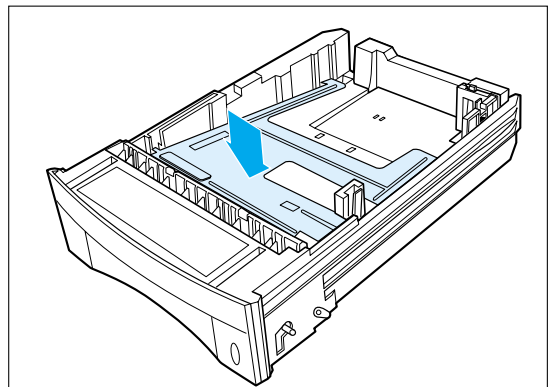

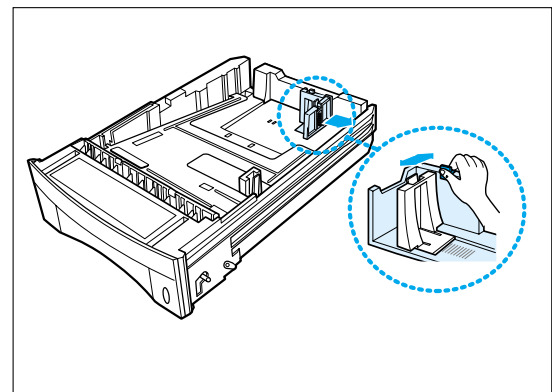

# Linux Driver Installation

This Linux driver is designed for Samsung ML-7300 Series printer and supports Linux Red Hat 6.0 or higher and Intel Linux. If your Linux version is not included, this driver might not work properly.

- Install Setup Script file configuration
  - a. /cdrom/linux/install.sh
  - b. /cdrom/linux/ssprt.db
  - c. /cdrom/linux/readme.txt

## Installation

---

To install the driver, open the x terminal screen and take the following steps:

### 1. Mount the CD-ROM drive.

**Notes:** To mount the CD-ROM drive, you must be a super user or must be authorized to mount the CD-ROM by the super user. If you fail to mount the CD-ROM drive, ask the system administrator.

To mount the CD-ROM drive:

- 1 Insert the Samsung ML-7300 Series CD-ROM into the CD-ROM drive.
- 2 Mount the CD-ROM drive under a directory like **/mnt** in order to access the files on the CD-ROM:  
**>mount -t iso9660 /dev/cdrom /mnt/cdrom**

### 2. Install setup script.

For details on installing the setup script, refer to the **/cdrom/linux/readme.txt** file.

Add the driver to the printer list by typing in:  
**/cdrom/linux>install.sh** (or)  
**/cdrom/linux>./install.sh** (if the path of the current working directory is not determined).



### 3. Set up the printer filter.

To set up:

- 1 Run **printtool** at x terminal.
- 2 To add the printer driver, click the **Add** button.
- 3 In the Add a Printer Entry window, decide the printer type you will use. Select **Local Printer** if you have a PC-connected printer.
- 4 Click the **OK** button.
- 5 If the **Info** button appears, ignore it, then click the **OK** button.
- 6 The Edit xxxx Entry window opens (where xxxx is the printer type you have selected at step 3).

If you are not an advanced user, do not change the **Names/Spool Directory/File Limit in Kb/Printer Device** option.

- 7 Click the **Select** button in the **Input Filter** to access filter setup.
- 8 Select **Samsung Printer PCL 5e Compatible** for the Printer Type item. Then select the default resolution and paper size.
- 9 To save the setting, press the **OK** button.
- 10 In the Edit xxxx Entry window, press the **OK** button to complete the printer driver installation.
- 11 You can find that the printer driver is added to the driver window. Select **Quit** from the **PrintTool** menu.
