## **▲ IMPORTANT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS**

These warnings are provided in the interests of your safety. Ensure that you understand them all before installing or using this appliance. Your safety is of paramount importance. If you are unsure about any of the meanings of these warnings contact the Customer Care Department.

#### **Prior to Installation**

 Check the appliance for transport damage. Under no circumstance should a damaged appliance be installed. In the event of damage please contact your retailer.

#### Installation

- This appliance is heavy. Care should be taken when moving it.
- It is dangerous to alter the specifications or attempt to modify this product in any way.
- Ensure that the appliance does not stand on the electrical supply cable.
  - **Important:** if the supply cable is damaged, it must be replaced by a cable available from the manufacturer or your local Service Force Centre.
- Any electrical work required to install this appliance should be carried out by a qualified electrician or competent person.
- Parts which heat up should not be exposed. Whenever possible, the back of the appliance should be close to a wall, but leaving the required distance for ventilation, as stated in the installation instructions.
- The appliance should be left for 2 hours after installation before it is turned on, in order to allow the refrigerant to settle.

### Refrigerant

- During transportation and installation of the appliance, be certain that none of the components of the refrigerant circuit become damaged.
- If the refrigerant circuit should become damaged:
  - avoid open flames and sources of ignition.
  - thoroughly ventilate the room in which the appliance is situated.

### **Child Safety**

- Do not allow children to tamper with the controls or play with the product.
- There is a risk of suffocation! Keep packaging material away from children!

### **During Use**

- This appliance is designed for domestic use only, specifically for the storage of edible foodstuffs only. It is not intended for commercial or industrial use.
- Containers with flammable gases or liquids can leak at low temperatures. Do not store any containers with flammable materials, such as spray cans, fire extinguisher refill cartridges etc. in the refrigerator.

### **Maintenance and Cleaning**

- Before cleaning, always switch off the appliance and disconnect from the electrical supply.
- When unplugging always pull the plug from the mains socket, do not pull on the cable.


### Servicing

- This product should be serviced by an authorised engineer and only genuine spare parts should be used.
- Under no circumstances should you attempt to repair the appliance yourself. Repairs carried out by inexperienced persons may cause injury or serious malfunctioning. Contact your local Service Force Centre.

### At the end of the Appliance Life

- When disposing of your appliance use an authorised disposal site.
- Remove the plug and ensure that any locks or catches are removed, to prevent young children being trapped inside.

# **i** OPERATION

#### Before use

Remove all securing tapes. Wash inside the appliance with lukewarm water and bicarbonate of soda (5 ml to 0.5 litre of water). Do not use soap or detergent as the smell may linger. Dry thoroughly.

### Setting the temperature

The temperature inside the refrigerator is regulated by a thermostat with 6 temperature positions and one «OFF» (O) position.

Position 1 = minimum coldness

Position 6 = maximum coldness

Turn the thermostat dial to the required position.

An intermediate position is usually the most suitable, although the temperature will be affected by:

- Room temperature
- How often the door is opened
- · How much food is stored
- Position of the appliance

In determining the correct temperature control setting all these factors have to be considered and some experimentation may be necessary.

When altering the temperature setting, allow 24 hours for the temperature to stablise before making further changes.



#### **Important**

During prolonged periods of abnormally hot weather, if the thermostat is set on too high a number, the cooling system may operate continuously and the fridge cooling plate may not defrost. Turning the knob to a lower number will cause the automatic defrosting to resume.

### Fresh food refrigeration

To obtain the best performance, do not store warm food or evaporating liquids in the refrigerator; do cover or wrap the food, particularly if it has a strong flavour.

Do not cover the shelves with any protective material, such as paper, cardboard or plastic, which may obstruct the air circulation through them.

To help you use your refrigerator correctly, here are some more useful hints:

Raw meat (beef, pork, lamb & chicken or poultry): wrap in polythene bags and place on top of the salad drawer.


Meat can only be stored safely in this way for one or two days at the most.

**Fruit & vegetables**: these should be thoroughly cleaned and placed in the bottom salad bin.

**Butter & cheese:** these should be placed in special airtight containers or wrapped in aluminium foil or polythene bags to exclude as much air as possible. **Milk bottles:** these should have a cap and should


**Milk bottles:** these should have a cap and should be stored in the bottle rack on the door.

The walls of the refrigerator are equipped with runners so that shelves can be positioned as desired.



#### The door shelves

Depending on the use of the bottle shelf (3) the short shelf (2) can be adjusted in the direction of the arrow (a).



For more thorough cleaning, shelves can be removed, then refitted in their position. To make these adjustements proceed as follows:

**top shelf (1):** gradually pull in the direction of the arrows until it comes free:

middle shelf (2): turn it in the direction of the arrows until it comes free from the metallic crosspiece (4); bottle shelf (3): push on the buttons (b) until it comes free, then pull it in the direction of the arrow.

### **Normal Operating Sounds**

You may hear faint gurgling or bubbling sounds when the refrigerant is pumped through the coils below, to the cooling evaporator.

When the compressor is on, the refrigerant is being pumped round, and you will hear a whirring sound or pulsating noise from the compressor. A thermostat controls the compressor, and you will hear a faint 'click' when the thermostat cuts in and out.

## **i** HEALTH AND SAFETY GUIDELINES

Because of consumer demand, preservatives have been removed from many pre-prepared foods. This together with the changes in shopping habits to a once-a-week shop, mean that safe handling and storage of food is even more important than ever.

The following tips should help you to ensure that the food in your home is in as perfect condition as possible.

- Keep the time between buying chilled food and placing it in your fridge as short as possible. Tests showed that the temperature of 1 litre of orange juice rose to 22°C in an hour between the supermarket and home. It then took 11 hours to get down to 7°C in the refrigerator.
- Keep the refrigerator door closed as much as possible.
- Do not push food together too much, try to allow air to circulate around each item.
- Cool cooked food as quickly as possible but do NOT place in the refrigerator until cool. (Leave food in a cool place in order that it can then be placed in the refrigerator as soon as possible).
- Do NOT mix raw and cooked meat, they must be in separate containers. Take care not to let the meat juices drip onto other food. If the meat does drip, remove everything and clean thoroughly.
- Do not store food uncovered.
- Remove suspect food from your refrigerator and clean the interior (see "Maintenance and Cleaning").

- Never allow spillages to dry and harden.
- Store eggs in the egg rack provided in the refrigerator door. Discard any broken or chipped eggs.
- Regularly check the refrigerator door seal to ensure that it is clean and free from debris.
- Always wash your hands with soapy water and dry them with a clean towel before handling food.
- Keep work surfaces clean and avoid cross contamination by not using the same work surface or knife, without washing them thoroughly in between.

### **COOL CHECK GUIDE**

The guide consists of a temperature sensitive strip sealed in a shelf trim.

When the fridge is operating at the safe temperature to store food the guide will appear black. If the temperature rises above this level the guide will show the words TOO WARM.

### **Positioning of the Cool Check**

The shelf with the cool check temperature guide must be placed in the fridge according to the instructions located on the fridge wall and always ensure the guide is at the front.

#### If the Cool Check Shows too Warm

In certain conditions the temperature guide may show TOO WARM.

- The fridge is switched off
- The door has been recently opened
- A quantity of warmer food has been introduced to the fridge
- The fridge temperature is above the recommended maximum for the safer storage of food.

The coolchek will change to show "TOO WARM" very quickly after the door has been opened. It will however take a number of hours to return to black, indicating that the temperature is correct.


The appliance should be left overnight and the coolcheck examined in the morning. If the coolcheck shows TOO WARM, turn the appliance to a colder setting leave overnight and examine again the following morning.




#### Hits and tips

The guide is only suitable for use in the model supplied.

When cleaning the shelf take care not to immerse in water, and wipe away any spills.






### **DEFROSTING**

The refrigerator automatically defrosts every time the compressor stops. The water is discharged, via the pipe, into a tray located at the back of the appliance above the compressor, where it evaporates.



#### **Important**

To avoid defrost water overflowing and dripping onto the food in the fridge, periodically clean the water discharge hole (F) situated under the vegetable drawers. Use the special cleaner provided (P) which you will find already inserted into the discharge hole



### MAINTENANCE AND CLEANING

Before any maintenance or cleaning work is carried out, DISCONNECT the appliance from the ELECTRICITY supply.

### Internal cleaning

Clean the inside and accessories with warm water and bicarbonate of soda (5ml to 0.5 litre of water). Rinse and dry thoroughly.

**NEVER USE** DETERGENTS, ABRASIVE POWDERS, HIGHLY PERFUMED CLEANING PRODUCTS OR WAX POLISHES, TO CLEAN THE INTERIOR AS THESE WILL DAMAGE THE SURFACE AND LEAVE A STRONG SMELL.

Clean the drain hole of the water trough at regular intervals and make sure that the drain hole is never obstructed, so that the defrost water may flow freely.




#### **Important**

Do not use abrasive products.

An accumulation of dust will affect the performance of the appliance and cause excessive electricity consumption.

The structure of the appliance permits to clean the rear zone close to the wall, using a vacuum cleaner.

- 1. Remove the plinth (1), then the ventilation grid (2);
- **2.** Carefully pull the air deflector out (3), checking that there is no water left from the defrosting.




### Periodic cleaning

The appliance is equipped with an air inlet filter (1) and an air outlet duct (2) on the ventilation grid. Keep clean to guarantee good ventilation and good working order of the appliance.

The filter can be removed and washed with water, as follows:

- 1. Pinch flaps (a) and (b) with fingers
- 2. Pull the filter down.
- 3. Pull the filter out.

To replace the filter reverse the process.




### Changing the light bulb

Should the interior light fail to work, first switch off the appliance and disconnect from the electricity supply, then replace the bulb as follows:

- 1. Unscrew the light cover and then pull it outward by pressing as shown in the figure. Unscrew the bulb and replace it with a new 15 watt bulb (available from your nearest Zanussi Service Force centre).
- **2.** Replace the light cover by sliding it into its original position and replacing the screw.

### When the appliance is not in use

When the appliance is not in use for long periods, disconnect from the electricity supply, empty all foods and clean the appliance, leaving the door ajar to prevent unpleasant smells.



### SOMETHING NOT WORKING?

Before contacting your local Service Force Centre check the following points.

**IMPORTANT:** If you call out an engineer to a fault listed below, or to repair a fault caused by incorrect use or installation, a charge will be made even if the appliance is under guarantee.

Excessive frost and ice has built up	<ul><li>Ensure the door is not left open.</li><li>Check that nothing is preventing the door from closing.</li><li>Is the door gasket intact and clean?</li></ul>
Noise	- Refer to normal operating sounds.
Water under the salad bin	- Check the drain hole is not blocked. (see Maintenance and Cleaning).

If after the above checks, there is still a fault, call your local Service Force Centre. In-guarantee customers should ensure that the above checks have been made as the engineer will make a charge if the fault is not a mechanical or electrical breakdown.

Please note that proof of purchase is required for any in-guarantee service calls.

### **GUARANTEE CONDITIONS**

### Standard guarantee conditions

We, Zanussi, undertake that if within 24 months of the date of purchase this Zanussi appliance or any part thereof is proved to be defective by reason only of faulty workmanship or materials, we will, at our option repair or replace the same FREE OF CHARGE for labour, materials or carriage on condition that:

- The appliance has been correctly installed and used only on the electricity supply stated on the rating plate.
- The appliance has been used for normal domestic purposes only, and in accordance with the manufactuer's instructions.
- The appliance has not been serviced, maintained repaired, taken apart or tampered with by any person not authorized by us.
- All service work under this guarantee must be undertaken by a Zanussi Service Force Centre.
- Any appliance or defective part replaced shall become the Company's property.
- This guarantee is in addition to your statutory and other legal rights.

Home visits are made between **8.30am** and **5.30pm** Monday to Friday. Visits may be available outside these hours in which case a **premium** will be charged.

#### **Exclusions**

#### This guarantee does not cover:

- Damage or calls resulting from transportation, improper use or neglect, the replacement of any light bulbs or removable parts of glass or plastic.
- Costs incurred for calls to put right an appliance which is improperly installed or calls to appliances outside the United Kingdom.
- Appliances found to be in use within a commercial environment, plus those which are subject to rental agreements.
- Products of Zanussi manufacture which are not marketed by Zanussi.

### **European Guarantee**

If you should move to another country within Europe then your guarantee moves with you to your new home subject to the following qualifications:

- The guarantee starts from the date you first purchased your product.

### **Positioning**

For this appliance to work efficiently, it should be located away from heat sources, e.g. cookers, radiators, boilers, direct sunlight etc. Best performance is obtained with ambient temperature between +10°C and +32°C.

For building-in and door reversibility, if necessary, refer to the relevant instructions in the following pages.

### **ELECTRICAL CONNECTION**

THIS APPLIANCE MUST BE EARTHED. The manufacturer declines any liability should this safety measure not be observed.

If the plug that is fitted to your appliance is not suitable for your socket outlet, it must be cut off and the appropriate plug fitted.

Remove the fuse from the cut off plug. The cut off plug should then be disposed of to prevent the hazard of shocks in case it should be plugged into a 13amp socket in another part of your home.



#### **Important**

The wires in the mains lead are coloured in accordance with the following code:

Green and Yellow - Earth
Blue - Neutral
Brown - Live

If you fit your own plug, the colours of the wires in the mains lead of your appliance, may not correspond with the markings identifying the terminals in your plug, proceed as follows:

Connect the Green and the Yellow (earth) wire to the terminal in the plug which is marked with the letter  $^{\text{KP}}$  or the earth symbol +, or coloured green and yellow.

Connect the blue (neutral) wire to the terminal in the plug which is marked with the letter «N» or coloured black.

Connect the brown (live) wire to the terminal in the plug which is marked with the letter «L» or coloured red.

The plug moulded onto the lead incorporates a fuse. For replacement, use a 13amp BS1362 fuse. Only ASTA or BSI approved fuses should be used.

The plug must not be used if the fuse cover/carrier is lost. The cover/carrier is indicated by the coloured insert at the base of the plug.

A replacement cover/carrier must be obtained from your local Zanussi Service Force Centre.



# i BUILDING-IN INSTRUCTIONS

Before carrying out any work, remove the plug from the power socket.

### **Grid preparation**

Remove the grid from the appliance pulling it towards you with hands.

#### Right door opening:

Remove the left side (A) of the grid cutting it from the rear (see figure, a).


#### Left door opening:


Remove the right side (B) of the grid cutting it from the rear (see figure, b).

To reposition the grid on the appliance proceed as follows:

Apply the grid to the base of the appliance by pushing the clasps (a) until they click.

**N.B.** The grid is to be assembled after having fixed the appliance in the niche with the brackets.






#### Door reversal

The appliance must be unplugged before starting work. To reverse the opening direction of the door, proceed as follows:

- 1. remove the top hinge (1) taking care not to let the door fall;
- 2. remove the bottom door hinge (5).
- **3.** take out the plugs (3) from the holes (F) and reinsert them in the holes (F<sub>1</sub>) on the opposite side;
- **4.** refit the upper hinge (1) on the opposite side, on the bottom (position A);
- **5.** refit the door on the pin of the hinge (1) in position A;
- **6.** insert the pin of the unscrewed bottom hinge (2) in the upper hole (G) of the door, therefore fix the hinge on the top in position B.






#### **Important**

After completion of the door reversal operation, verify that the door gasket is sealing onto the cabinet.


If the ambient temperature is cold (i.e. in Winter), the gasket may not fit perfectly to the cabinet. In that case, wait for the natural fitting of the gasket or accelerate this process by heating up the part involved with a normal hairdryer on a low setting.

# Building the appliance in under a worktop


The dimensions of the recessed installation area must correspond with those indicated in the figure. The appliance could be inserted between two units (a) or as an end unit (b).




The plug socket necessary for connection of the appliance to the electricity supply should be positioned, so that the plug is not placed in the recess.




Fasten the side panel to the rear of the appliance with the fixing brackets.




Fasten the appliance to the worktop or the sides, applying the sealing strip between the refrigerator and adjacent cabinet using the fixing brackets (E).




The appliance is equipped with adjustable support feet. To adapt the appliance to the height of the installation area (max 870 mm), screw in, or screw out the feet situated to the four bottom corners.




Separate parts A, B, C, D as shown in the figure.




Place guide (A) on the inside part of the furniture door, up and down as shown in the figure and mark the position of external holes. After having drilled holes, fix the guide with the screws supplied.



Fix cover (C) on guide (A) until it clips into place.




Open the appliance door and the furniture door at 90°. Insert the small square (B) into guide (A). Put together the appliance door and the furniture door and mark the holes as indicated in the figure. Remove the squares and drill holes with  $\emptyset$  2 mm at 8 mm from the outer edge of the door. Place the small square on the guide again and fix it with the screws supplied.




Should the lining up of the furniture door be necessary, use the clearance of slots.

At the end of operations, it is necessary to check if the door of the furniture closes properly.



Fix cover (D) on guide (B) until it clips into place.




### Fitting the plinth




#### **Important**

For the efficient operation of the appliance, it is important that the original ventilation grid is used.



- For an opening height dimension A=820 mm and a plinth height dimension a=100 mm, the plinth may be fitted without adjustments. The same applies to an opening height dimension B=870 mm and a plinth height dimension b=150 mm.
- For plinth heights greater than a=100 mm, b=150 mm, a cut should be made in the plinth, 580 mm wide, in the centre of the appliance position, leaving a remaining height of a=100 mm, b=150 mm.
- Attach plinth to the kitchen units.





#### **Important**

The plinth must be positioned at a minimun distance of 25 mm from the door.



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
