LIMITED WARRANTY

For one year from the date of original retail purchase, MTD PRODUCTS INC will either repair or replace, at its option, free of charge, F.O.B. factory or authorized service firm, any part or parts found to be defective in material or workmanship. Transportation charges under this warranty must be paid by the purchaser unless return is requested by MTD PRODUCTS INC.

This warranty will not apply to any part which has become inoperative due to misuse, excessive use, accident, neglect, improper maintenance, alterations, or unless the unit has been operated and maintained in accordance with the instructions furnished. This warranty does not apply to the engine, motor, battery, battery charger or component parts thereof. Please refer to the applicable manufacturer's warranty on these items.

This warranty will not apply where the unit has been used commercially.

Warranty service is available through your local authorized service dealer or distributor. If you do not know the dealer or distributor in your area, please write to the Customer Service Department of MTD.

The return of a complete unit will not be accepted by the factory unless prior written permission has been extended by MTD.

This warranty gives you specific legal rights. You may also have other rights which vary from state to state.

WARNING TO PURCHASERS OF INTERNAL COMBUSTION ENGINE EQUIPPED MACHINERY OR DEVICES IN THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

The equipment which you have just purchased does not have a spark arrester. If this equipment is used on any forest covered land, brush covered land, or grass covered unimproved land in the State of California, before using on such land, the California law requires that a spark arrester be provided. In addition, spark arrester is required by law to be in effective working order. The spark arrester must be attached to the exhaust system and comply with Section 4442 of the California Public Resources Code.



It is suggested that this manual be read in its entirety before attempting to assemble or operate. Keep this manual in a safe place for future reference and for ordering replacement parts.

This unit is shipped WITHOUT GASOLINE or OIL. After assembly, see operating section of this manual for proper fuel and amount.

Your rotary mower is a precision piece of power equipment, not a plaything. Therefore exercise extreme caution at all times.

SAFE OPERATION PRACTICES FOR WALK-BEHIND MOWERS

TRAINING

- 1. Read the Operating and Service Owner's Manual carefully. Be thoroughly familiar with the controls and the proper use of the equipment.
- 2. Never allow children to operate a power mower. Only persons well acquainted with these rules of safe operation should be allowed to use your mower.
- 3. Keep the area of operation clear of all persons, particularly small children and pets. Stop engine when they are in the vicinity of your mower. Although the area of operation should be completely cleared of foreign objects, a small object may have been overlooked and could be accidently thrown by the mower in any direction.

PREPARATION

- 1. Thoroughly inspect the area where the equipment is to be used and remove all stones, sticks, wire, bones and other foreign objects which could be picked up and thrown by the mower in any direction.
- 2. Do not operate equipment when barefoot or wearing open sandals. Always wear substantial footwear.
- 3. Do not wear loose fitting clothing that could get caught on the mower.
- 4. Check the fuel before starting the engine. Do not fill the gasoline tank indoors, when the engine is running, or while the engine is still hot. Wipe off any spilled gasoline before starting the engine.
- 5. Disengage the self-propelled mechanism or drive clutch on units so equipped before starting the engine.
- 6. Never attempt to make a wheel or cutting height adjustment while the engine is running.
- 7. Mow only in daylight or in good artificial light.
- 8. Never operate the equipment in wet grass. Always be sure of your footing; keep a firm hold on the handle and walk, never run.

OPERATION

- 1. Do not change the engine governor settings or overspeed the engine. Excessive engine speeds are dangerous.
- 2. Do not put hands or feet near or under rotating parts. Keep clear of the discharge opening at all times.
- 3. Stop the blade(s) when crossing gravel drive, walks or roads.
- 4. After striking a foreign object, stop the engine, remove the wire from the spark plug,

- thoroughly inspect the mower for any damage, and repair the damage before restarting and operating the mower.
- 5. If the equipment should start to vibrate abnormally, stop the engine and check immediately for the cause. Vibration is generally a warning of trouble.
- 6. Stop the engine whenever you leave the mower, before cleaning the mower housing, and when making any repairs or inspections.
- 7. When cleaning, repairing or inspecting, make certain the blade and all moving parts have stopped. Disconnect the spark plug wire, and keep the wire away from the plug to prevent accidental starting.
- 8. Before attempting to unclog the mower or discharge chute, stop the engine and be sure the blade(s) have stopped completely. Disconnect the spark plug wire and keep the wire away from the plug to prevent accidental starting.
- 9. Do not run the engine indoors.
- 10. Shut the engine off and wait until the blade comes to a complete stop before removing the grass catcher.
- 11. Mow across the face of slopes, never up-anddown. Exercise extreme caution when changing direction on slopes. Do not mow excessively steep slopes.
- 12. Always disconnect electric mowers (line operated) before cleaning, repairing or adjusting.
- 13. Never operate mower without proper guards, plates or other safety protective devices in place.
- 14. Keep washout ports and other mowerhousing service openings closed when mowing.


MAINTENANCE AND STORAGE

- 1. Check the blade and engine mounting bolts at frequent intervals for proper tightness.
- 2. Keep all nuts, bolts, and screws tight to be sure the equipment is in safe working condi-
- 3. Never store the equipment with gasoline in the tank inside of a building where fumes may reach an open flame or spark. Allow the engine to cool before storing in any enclosure.
- 4. To reduce fire hazard, keep the engine free of grass, leaves, or excessive grease.
- 5. Check the grass catcher bag frequently for wear or deterioration. For safety protection replace only with new bag meeting original equipment specifications.

HANDLE ASSEMBLY



It may be necessary to bend the ends of the lower handle outward slightly to assure a snug fit against the bracket mounting area.





Please note that the chute deflector on your mower is in an upright position. It is held in that position by a shipping block. This block is used for shipping purposes only. It must be removed and discarded before your mower is put into operation.



This mower should be broken in following the procedure described in the break-in instructions. The added effort here will double the service life of the unit. Particular attention should be paid to the notes on alignment.

When operating this mower, unnecessary or excessive engaging of the drive pinions with the wheels should be avoided. This is achieved by minimizing the raising and lowering of the handle during the mowing operation. Failure to observe this operating rule can reduce the service life of the front tires and drive pinions substantially. When engaging the self-propelled mechanism, a slight forward push on the mower as the drive pinions and the gear tread tires mesh will add to smoother and quieter operation. In addition to a smoother operation, it will add substantially to the service life of both the tires and the drive pinions.

HANDLE ASSEMBLY PRECAUTIONS

Although the handle is of simple design, difficulty has been encountered in its assembly. Certain precautions concerning its assembly must be heeded. The handle must be assembled as shown in the diagram on page 4. Trouble arises when certain parts are put together improperly.

BREAK-IN INSTRUCTIONS

- Before starting the engine, lubricate all the bronze bearings on the drive shaft. The same oil which is used for the engine may be used for this.
- Check drive assembly alignment. When the handle is lifted the clutch rod is moved to the self-propelled position. The black nylon drive pinions should mesh simultaneously with the gear tread tires.

OPERATION



NOTE

For shipping purposes your mower is set with the wheels in a low cutting height position. For best results, raise the cutting position until it is determined which height is best for your lawn. See adjustments.

- Service engine with gas and oil. See Engine Maintenance for complete instructions for care and maintenance of engine. READ DIRECTIONS CAREFULLY.
- Lubricate bronze bearings on drive shaft.
- 3. Check drive assembly for correct alignment (See Break-in Instructions).
- 4. When ready to start engine, be sure handle is all the way back into free wheeling position. Start engine, after engine starts, move throttle control lever on handle to the desired engine speed.
- When the handle is moved forward for self-propelled operation, the drive pinions engage with the gear tread tires and forward drive results.
- Temporary free wheeling is achieved by depressing the handle and raising front wheels slightly off the ground. Self-propelled drive is resumed when handle is raised. Engine is stopped by placing control lever on handle into STOP position.

LUBRICATION



Always stop engine and disconnect spark plug wire before cleaning, lubricating or doing any kind of work on lawn mower. Wheels—Rear wheel bearings are of self-lubricating Fortiflex. They require no lubrication. Front drive wheels are equipped with sintered bearings. Lubricate at least once a season with light oil.

Throttle—Periodically lubricate throttle control lever and throttle wire assembly with a few drops of light oil SAE No. 10 or 20 for ease of operations.

Bronze Bearings—Periodically lubricate all bronze bearings with a few drops of light oil SAE No. 10 or 20 to minimize friction.

Chute Deflector—The torsion spring and pivot point should be lubricated periodically with light oil to prevent any rust or binding. Deflector must work freely.

Engine—See Engine Maintenance for lubrication instructions.

ADJUSTMENTS



Do not at any time make any adjustment to lawn mower without first stopping engine and disconnecting spark plug wire.

Cutting Height—Adjustment may be made by removing and moving wheel studs to desired position. Cutting heights will be raised as wheel studs are moved to a lower hole and lowered as wheel studs are moved to a higher hole in the deck. All wheel studs must be mounted in a relative position to the deck. See figures 1, 2 and 3.







Belleville washer goes on axle, crown side towards wheel. See figure 2.

- 1. Select desired height and tighten axle bolt.
- 2. Raise the lower handle, adjust ferrule (if necessary) and slide ferrule through hole in lower handle. Secure with hair pin cotter.

Throttle—If adjustment becomes necessary, the throttle control wire assembly can be reset as follows:

- 1. Lousen, but do not remove, screw securing throttle control wire assembly at engine.
- 2. Move throttle control lever on handle to FAST position.

3. Move lever, to which control wire is fastened at engine, to full open position and retighten screw to secure throttle control wire assembly.

CLUTCH ROD ADJUSTMENT

If adjustment becomes necessary, or if the cutting height is changed from the lowest setting to the highest setting the clutch rod may have to be reset as follows:

- 1. Remove the cotter pin. See figure 4.
- 2. Pull the clutch rod and ferrule out of the lower handle. See figure 5.
- 3. Thread the ferrule on or off the rod one turn and check for alignment.
- Place ferrule back in position and secure with cotter pin. If the engagement is still not correct, repeat the above steps.





MAINTENANCE

Cutting Blade—The blade may easily be removed for grinding or replacement as follows:

- 1. Remove bolt and lockwasher holding blade and blade adapter to engine crankshaft.
- Remove blade and blade adapter from engine crankshaft.
- 3. Remove two bolts, lockwashers and nuts holding blade to blade adapter (if necessary).

When sharpening blade, follow the original angle of grind as a guide. It is extremely important that each cutting edge receives an equal amount of grinding to prevent an unbalanced blade. An unbalanced blade will cause excessive vibration when rotating at high speeds and may cause damage to the mower.



To insure safe operation of your unit, ALL nuts and bolts must be checked periodically for correct tightness.

Deck—The underside of mower deck should be cleaned after each period of use as grass clippings, leaves, dirt and other matter will accumulate. This accumulation of grass clippings, etc., is undesirable as it will invite corrosion and cause an uneven discharge of grass clippings at the next cutting.

The deck may be cleaned by tilting the mower forward or on its left side and scraping clean with a suitable tool or by washing with a stream of water from a garden hose.



Do not direct the stream of water at a hot engine as damage to the engine may result.

STORAGE

The following steps should be taken to prepare lawn mower for storage.

- 1. Clean and lubricate mower thoroughly as described in the preceding instructions.
- Refer to engine manual for correct engine storage instructions.
- Coat mower's cutting blade with chassis grease to prevent rusting.

- Place blocks under deck to raise tires clear of floor.
- 5. Store mower in a dry, clean area.

USING YOUR ROTARY MOWER

For best results do not cut wet grass because it tends to stick to the underside of the mower thus preventing proper discharge of grass clippings. If wet grass must be cut, reduce walking speed to help distribute the clippings more effectively.

New grass should be treated as wet grass, otherwise a normal walking speed is about the right pace for efficient mowing.

The best mowing pattern is one that allows the clippings to discharge towards the uncut part of the lawn. This permits recutting of the clippings to further pulverize them. When cutting high weeds, discharge towards cut portion, then recut at right angles to first direction.

Lawn should be cut in the fall as long as there is growth.

HANDLE STORAGE

The handle may be put in a storage position; use the following steps:

- 1. Remove hairpin cotter from ferrule on clutch rod.
- 2. Pull the ferrule out of the handle.
- 3. Replace the hairpin cotter.
- Press inward on the lower handle and move it forward.
- 5. To put the handle back into the operating position, simply pull the handle back. It will lock automatically.

BELT REMOVAL

- 1. Remove the pinion cover.
- 2. Remove both tension springs. (See figure 6.)
- 3. Using a screw driver remove the E-rings and pinions on both wheels.
- Remove the shoulder bolt, lockwashers and nut on the belt cover.
- 5. Remove the engagement rod.
- 6. Slide the belt cover to the left.
- 7. Unhook the belt from the idler and the pulleys.

- 8. Remove the shoulder bolt, lockwasher and nut from the cover support bracket.
- 9. Remove belt and reassemble in reverse order with a new belt.

OFF-SEASON STORAGE


If the machine is to be inoperative for a period longer than 30 days, the following procedures are recommended:

 Working outdoors, drain all fuel from the fuel tank. Use a clean dry cloth to absorb the small amount of fuel remaining in the tank, then run the engine until all fuel in the carburetor is exhausted.



Do not drain fuel while smoking, or if near an open fire.

- Drain all the oil from the crankcase (this should be done after the engine has been operated and is still warm) and refill the crankcase with clean new oil.
- 3. Disconnect the spark plug wire and remove the spark plug from the cylinder. Pour about 2 or 3 tablespoons of engine oil into the cylinder, and then turn the engine over several times to spread out the oil. Replace the spark plug, but do not connect the wire.
- 4. Clean the engine and the entire mower thoroughly.





The manufacturer DOES NOT recommend the use of any accessory on this rider mower other than those manufactured by MTD Products Inc.

GRASS CATCHER Model No. 198-003A is available as optional equipment for the mowers shown in this manual.



- 1. The mower should not be operated without the entire grass catcher or chute deflector in place.
- 2. The mower should not be operated without the protective shield on the rear of the deck in place.




Under normal usage bag material is subject to wear and should be checked periodically. Be sure any replacement bag complies with the mower manufacturer's recommendations.


For replacement bags, use only factory authorized replacement bag No. 764-0119.


